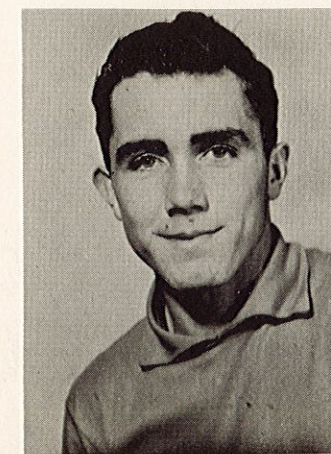
When we get old and think about the days gone by,
