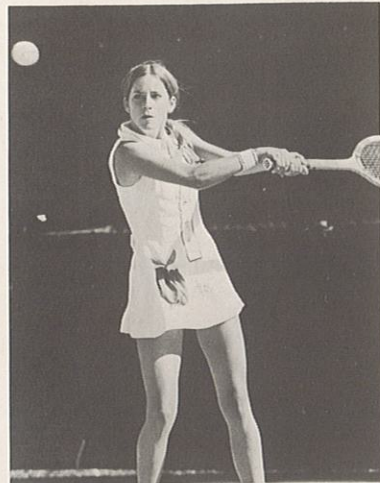
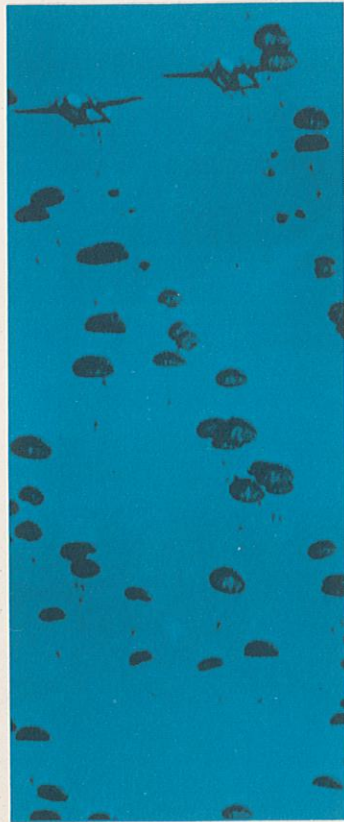

Focusing attention on ecological distress, groups could always find projects close at home.

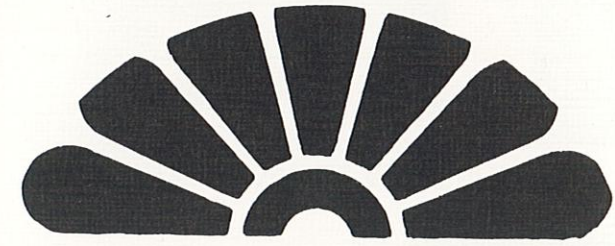
A resurging interest in religion among youth was called "The Jesus Revolution," along with the hit song, "Jesus Christ, Superstar."

## Dedication

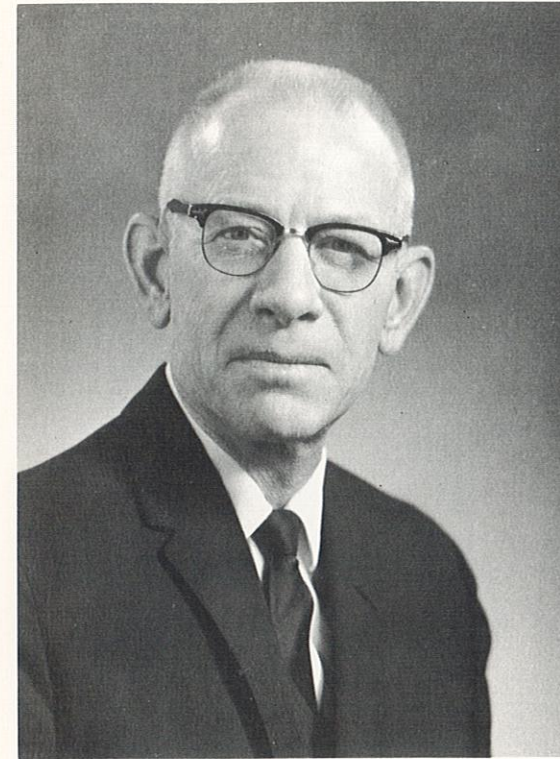

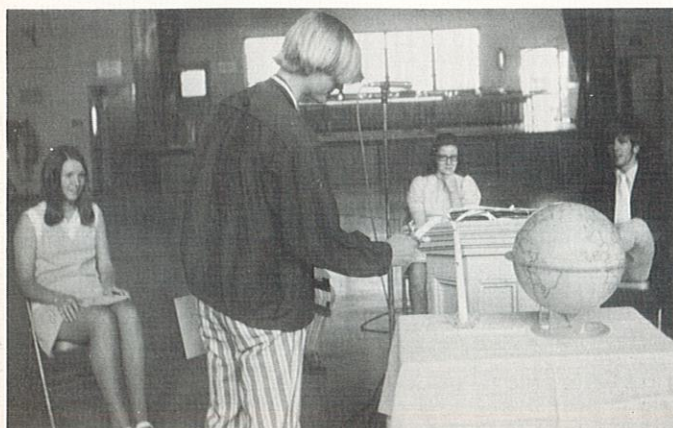
