The Brashear Tigers and Tigerettes were hosts to the Queen City Rams. At 7:00, the girls game began proving that either side could win and it would be a battle to the end. Starters from Brashear were R. Helton, J. Mountain, L. March, M. Osborn, and K. Hill. It was a close game throughout. At the end of the first quarter, the score was 6 to 4 in Brashear's favor. The half time score was 10 to 11, with Queen City ahead. Our girls were traveling along when the score at the third quarter was 19 to 14. The Brashear Tigerettes became the victors when the final score was 25 to 22. Others seeing action were J. Cameron, K. Cooper, and C. Bunch.

The coronation ceremony was held before the boys game got underway. Mrs. Madeline Crockett gave a brief introduction as the candidates walked in. Miss Kathy Cooper, escorted by Randy Jeffries, was crowned 1973-74 Homecoming Queen by Rhonda Helton, the retiring queen and her escort Mike Elam. 

The Future Homemakers of America have had an exciting year planning different activities.


In November the F.H.A. members sponsored the March of Dimes Bread Drive. The donations they collected came to \$150. A dance was held afterwards.

The Mother-Daughter Tea was held May 16. Several of the members and their mothers attended and enjoyed the program which was the Installation Ceremony by Candlelight.




