This past year has been an enjoyable one for the seniors and they have had a fair amount of success with the basketball season.

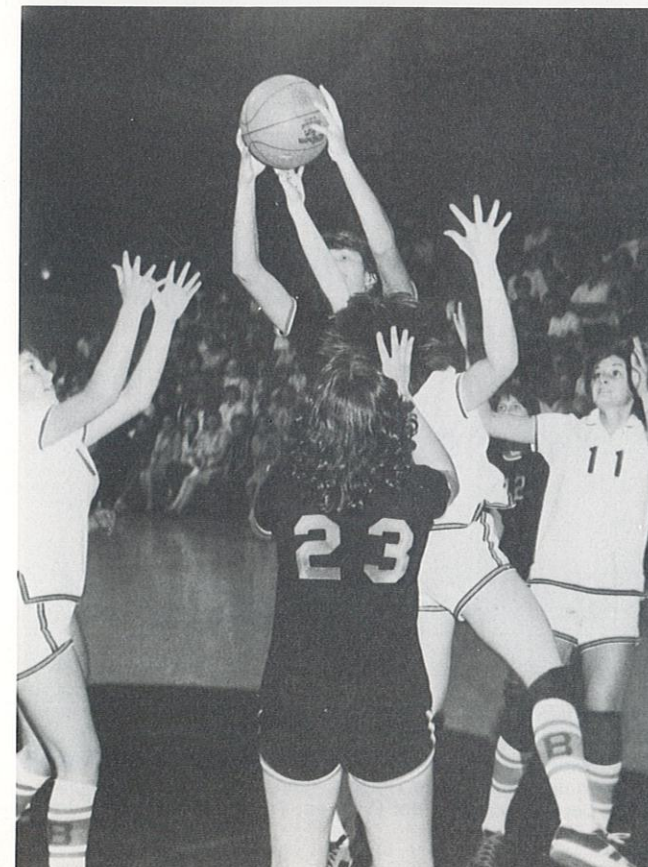

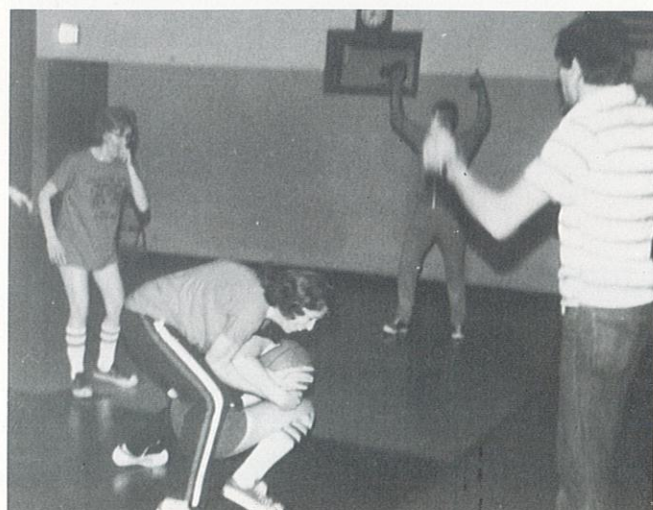
