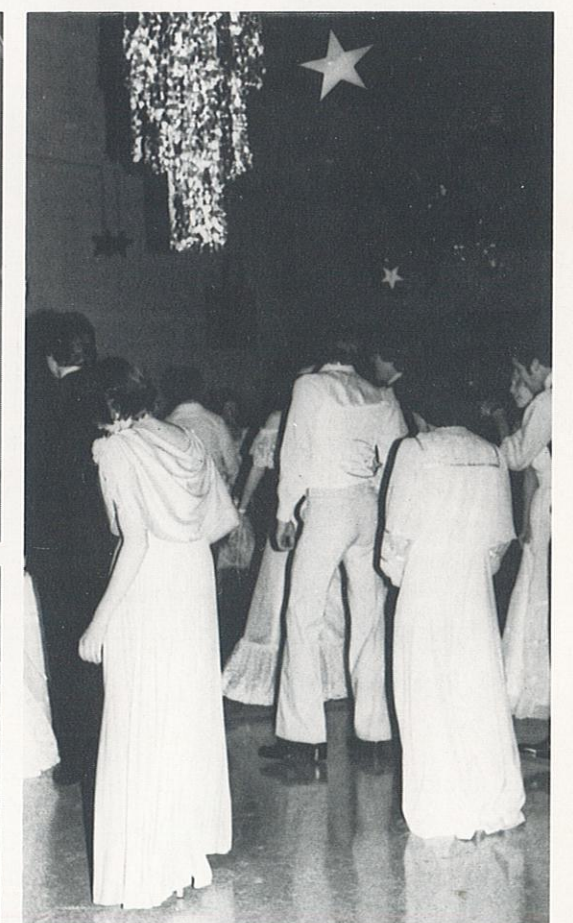
The Junior class of 1980-81 presented the Junior-Senior Prom, "Lost In Love" April 18, 1981, at the Brashear High School Gym.
