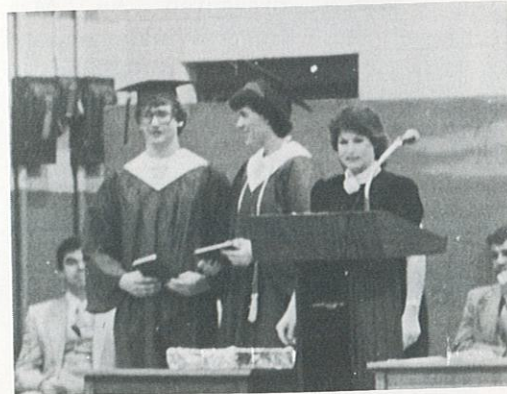
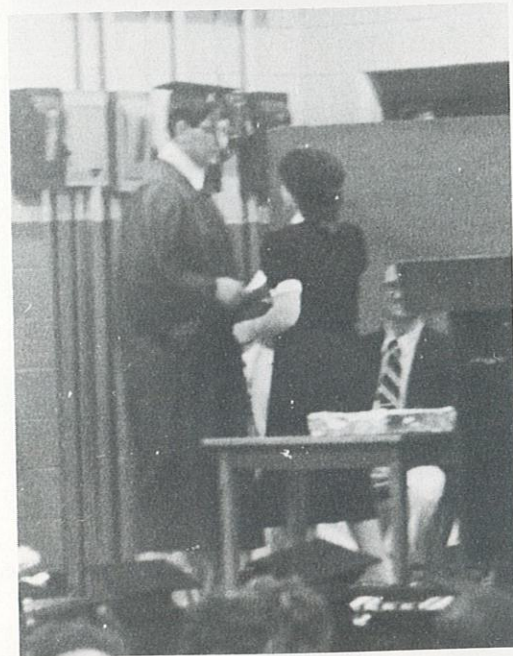
# Sixth Grade Graduates
