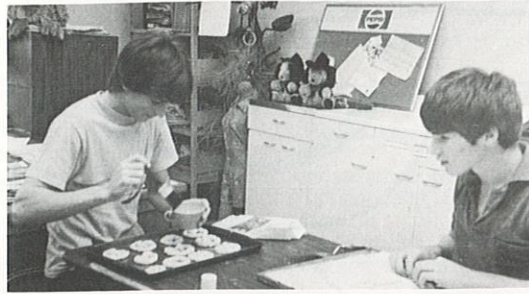
Our former "Little Lori Jean" Lowe is now a famous fashion model. Lori grew 9" after graduating. She says, "School pressures were holding me down."

Student Council representatives were Chris Taylor and Molly McKim. Activity coordinators were Karen White and David Rigdon.



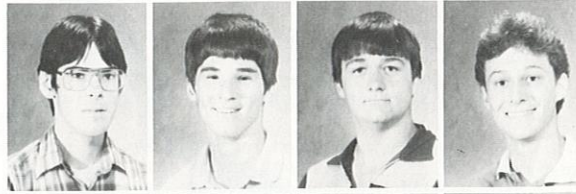

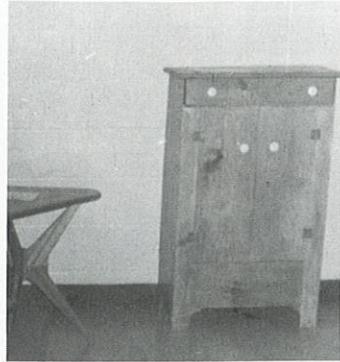
# F.H.A. Trip To St. Louis, Missouri
