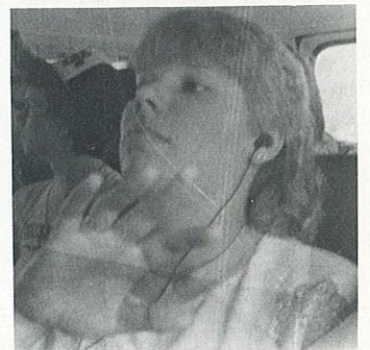
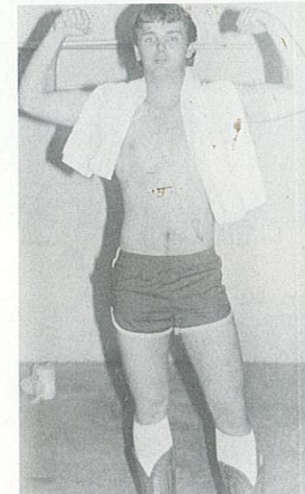
One Week Jaunt Through . . .

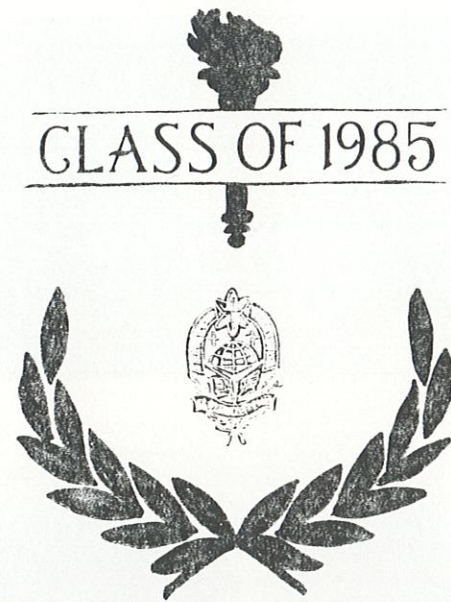

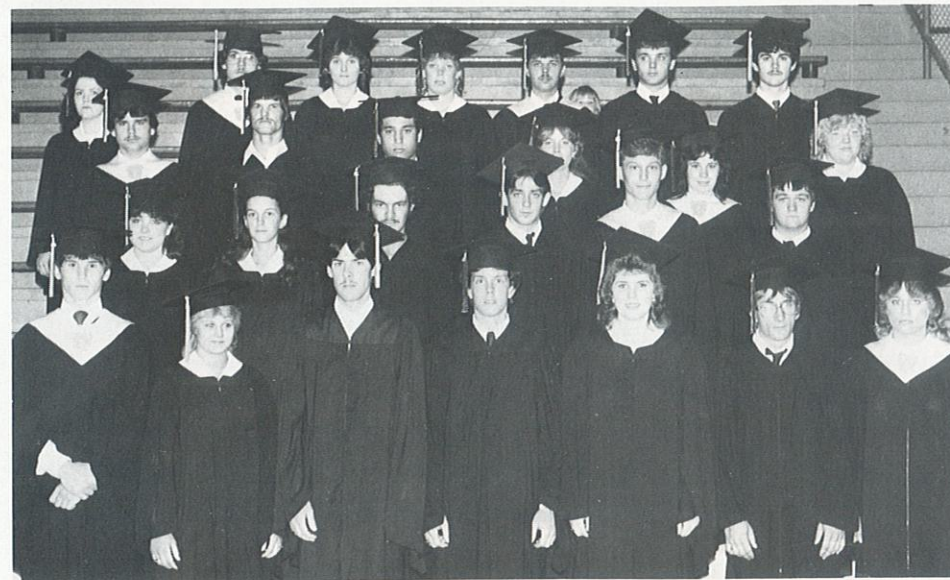

MARY WILLIAMS went on to become a rock star groupee and is currently in the Caribbeans.

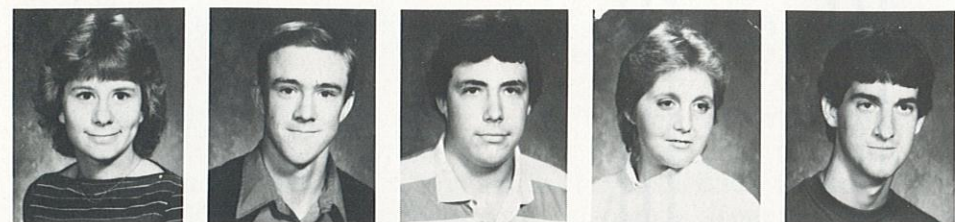

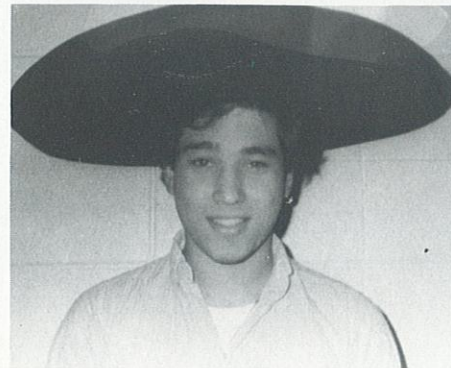
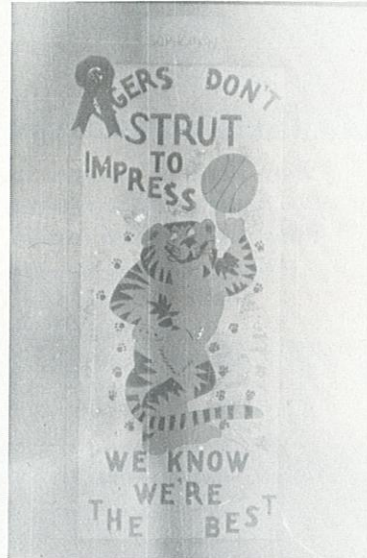
Homecoming Activities
