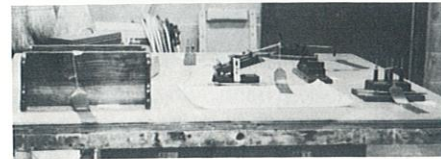
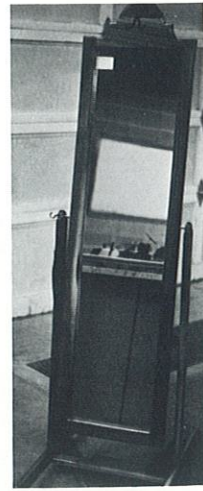


January 15, 1987 was the scheduled date for the annual 5th and 6th grade basketball game. This event was held following a brief P.T.S. meeting.

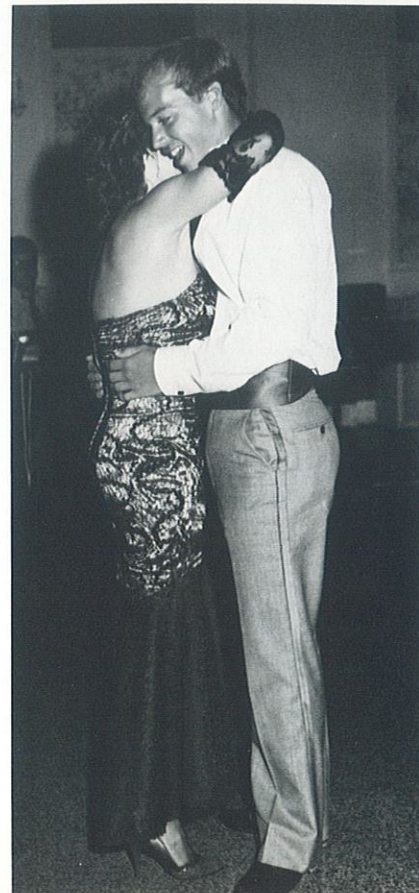

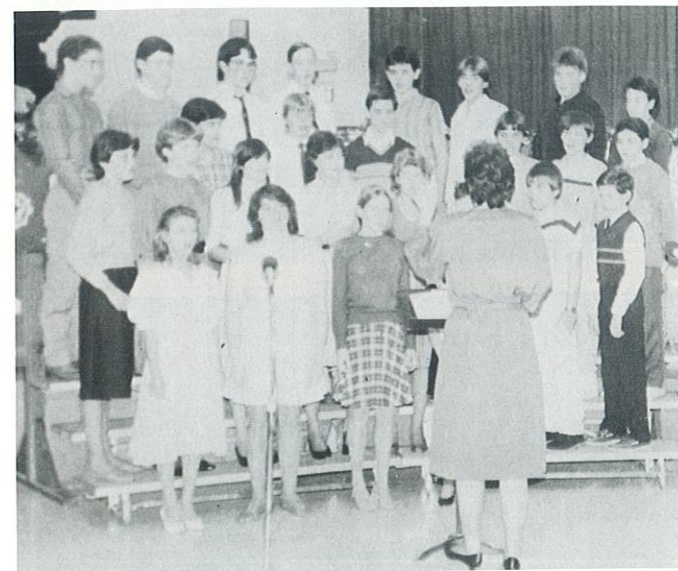

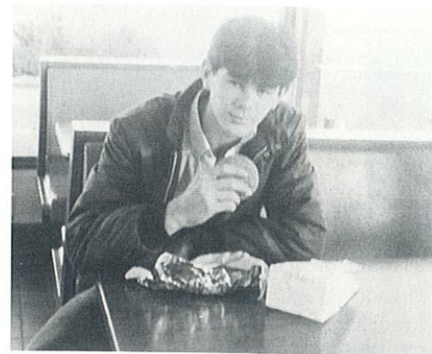
