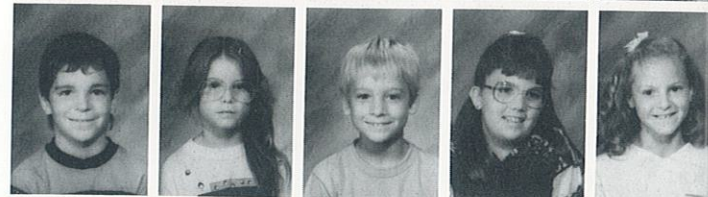

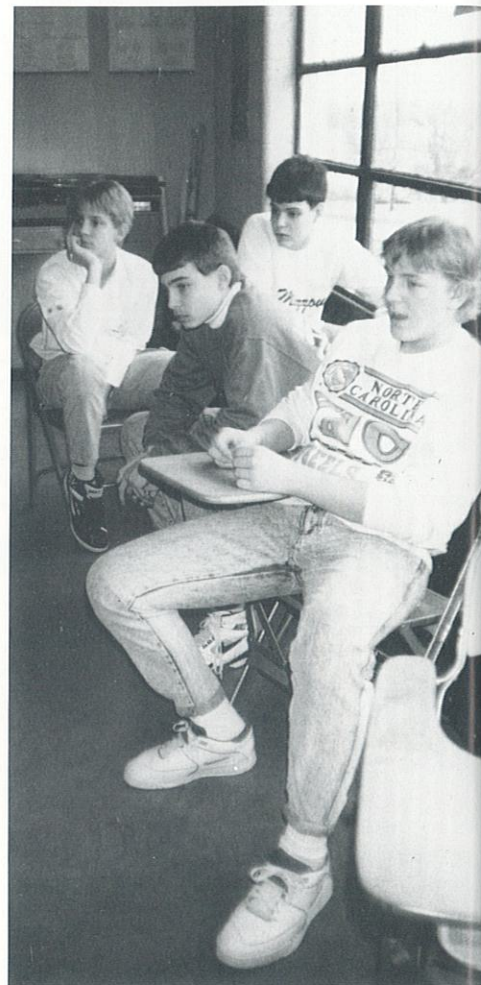
CLEAN AND SOBER

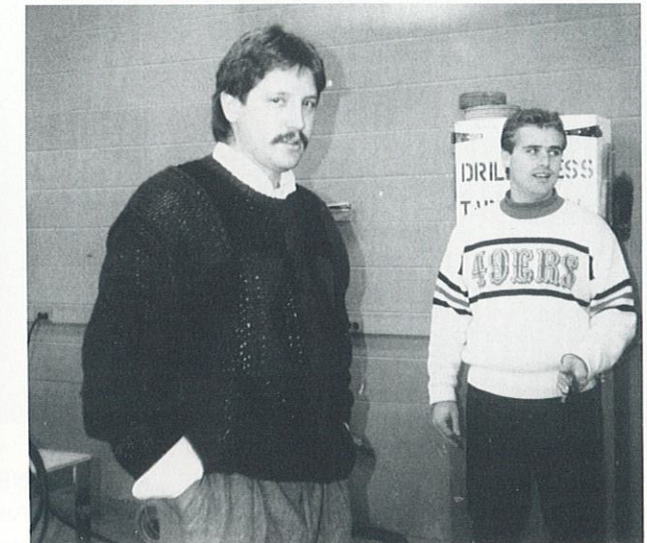

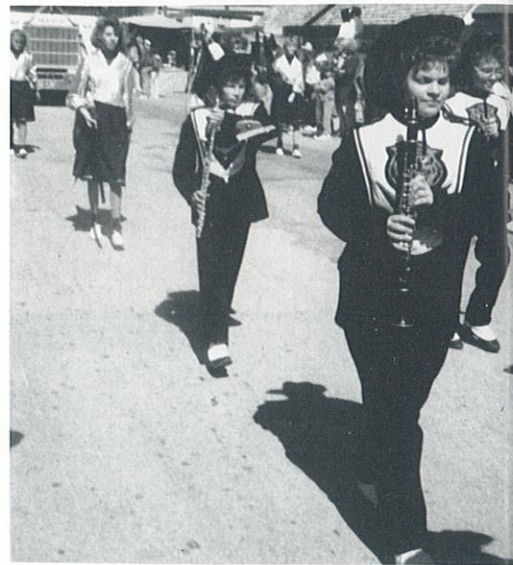

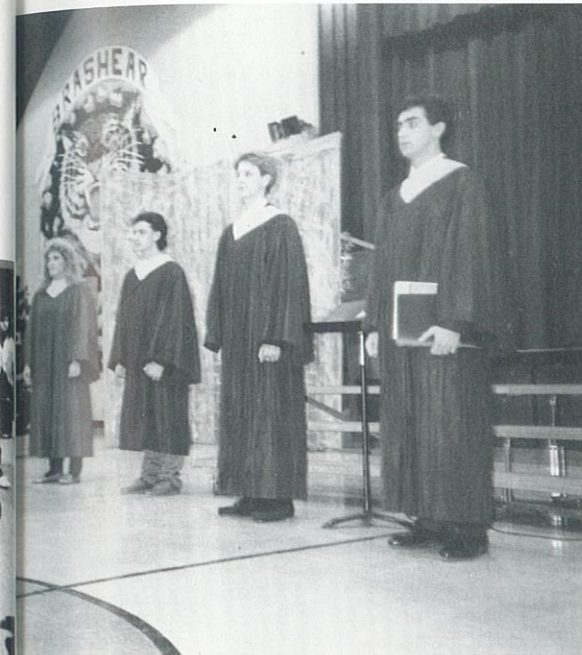

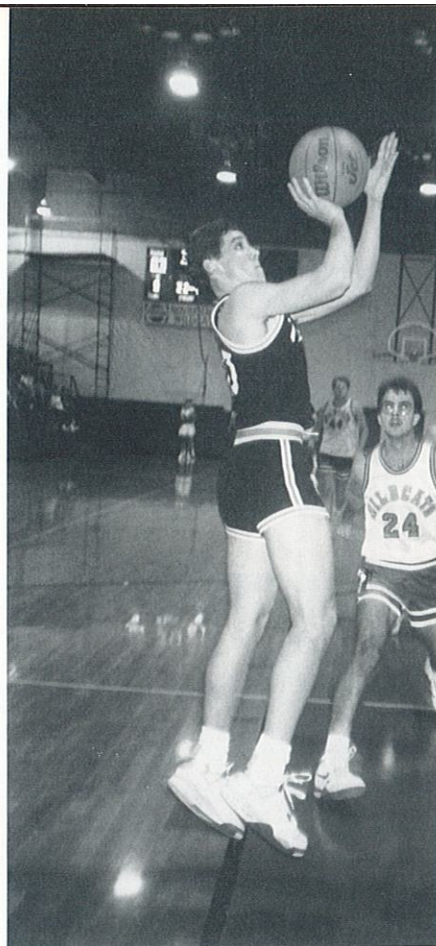

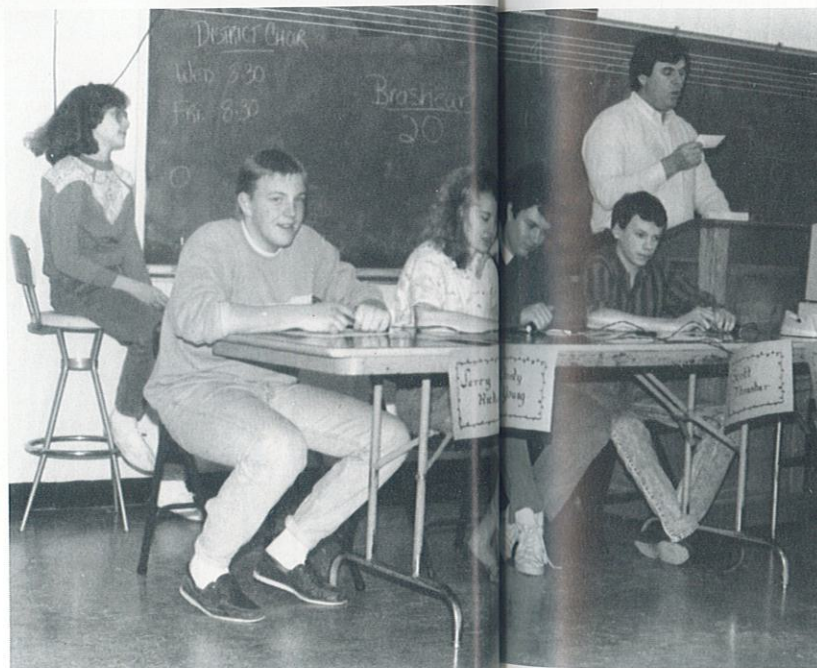
