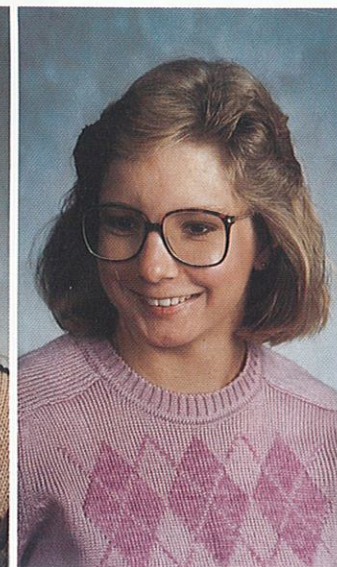


Senior Class Of 1991

TREMORS AT HOME

In 1905 an earthquake rocked the Missouri Bootheel. In 1990 Albuquerque-based climatologist, Iben Browning, predicted another such earthquake to occur along the New Madrid fault on December 3.

The New Madrid fault runs north from Marked Tree, Arkansas through the Bootheel and on to Cairo, Illinois. The parts predicted to be affected drastically in Missouri included the areas closest to the Bootheel although parts in Northeast Missouri would experience falling plaster, broken windows and slight ground vibrations. Several schools in Missouri heeded Browning's prediction and took precautions. Brashear held earthquake drills and put together a safety booklet entitled "Tremor Tips" for the students and parents. Teachers discussed the earthquake and its implications in class.

Students in fifth and sixth grade were asked before the predicted December third earthquake, the question "If you could take one thing with you to keep it safe during the earthquake, what would it be?"

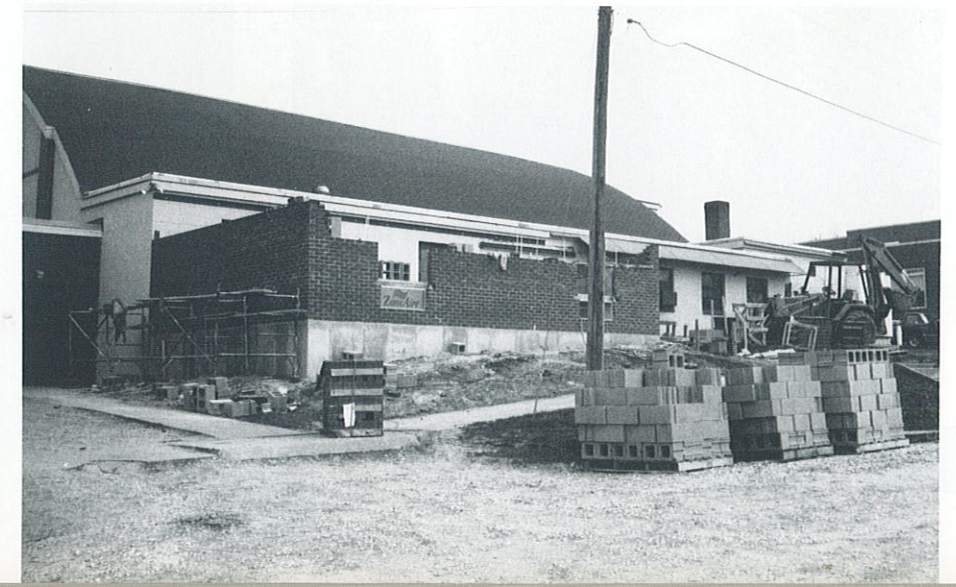
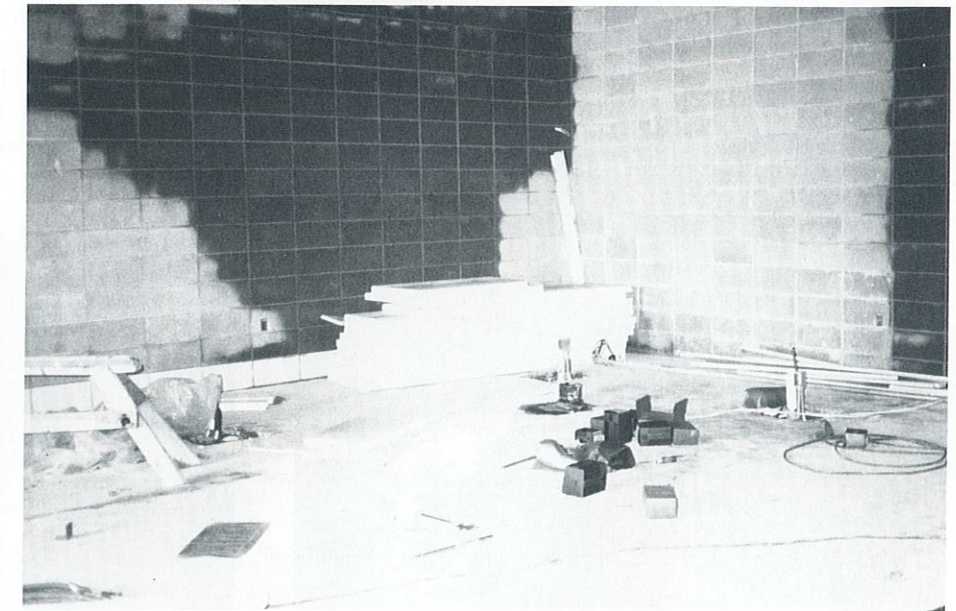
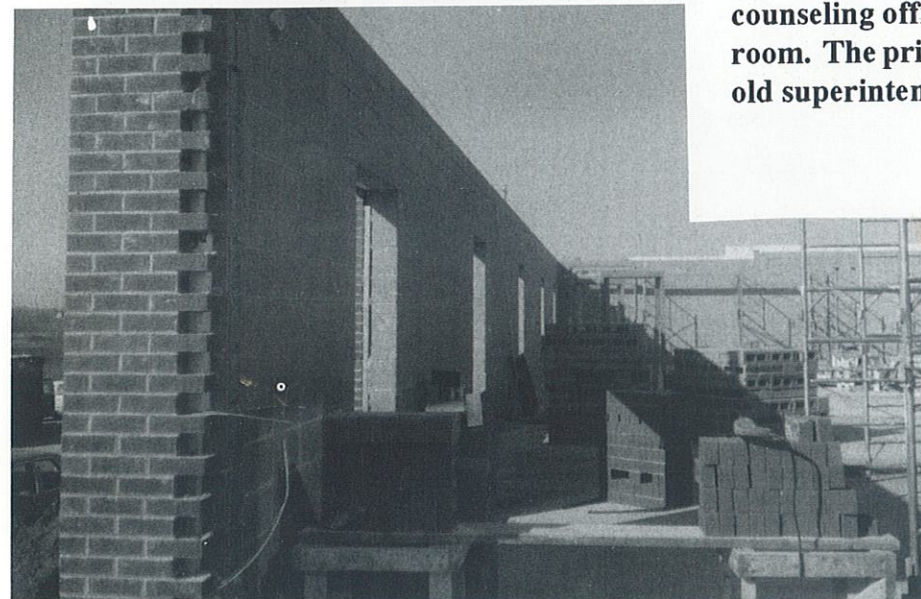
NEW SCHOOL

Bond issue passed in August, 1990 and new school addition is completed in June, 1991.

Tuesday, August 7, 1990, the bond issue for the new addition to the school was passed. Architect Roger Frangkiser drew up the plans for the addition which included rooms for library, English, Spanish/math, music, two bathrooms, and a new office for the superintendent.

Whiston Construction Company of Canton, Missouri broke ground October, 1990 and finished June, 1991. Remnants and Moore of Quincy, Klote Heating and Refrigeration of Kirksville and Bistate Roofing of Jefferson City also contributed to the final product.

The library moved into the new addition and kindergarten replaced the old library. The lunchroom was placed in the old music room and serves as a multi-purpose area. The learning disabilities was placed in the elementary and high school buildings. The counseling office was placed in the old lunchroom. The principal's office was moved to the old superintendent's office.

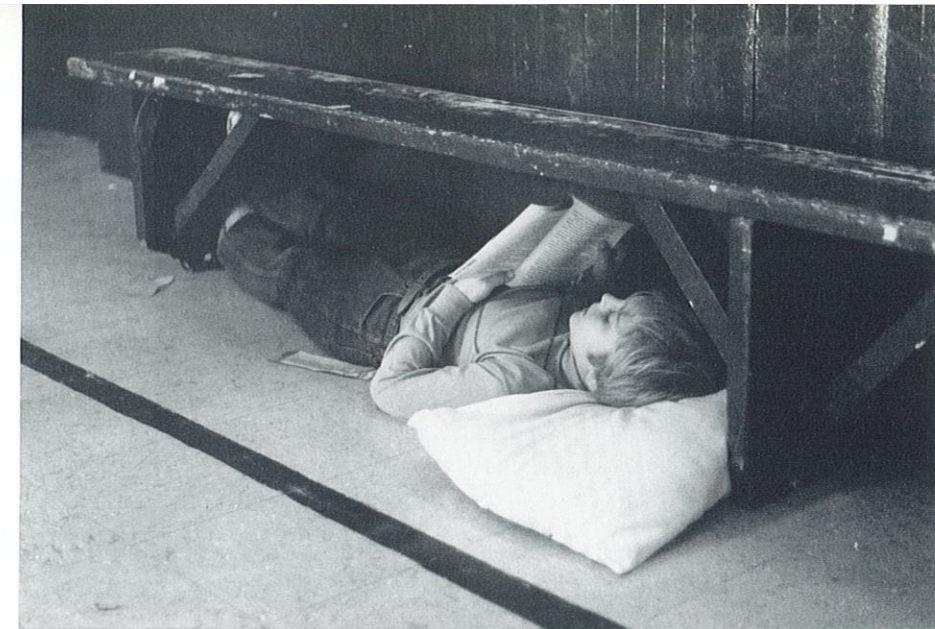
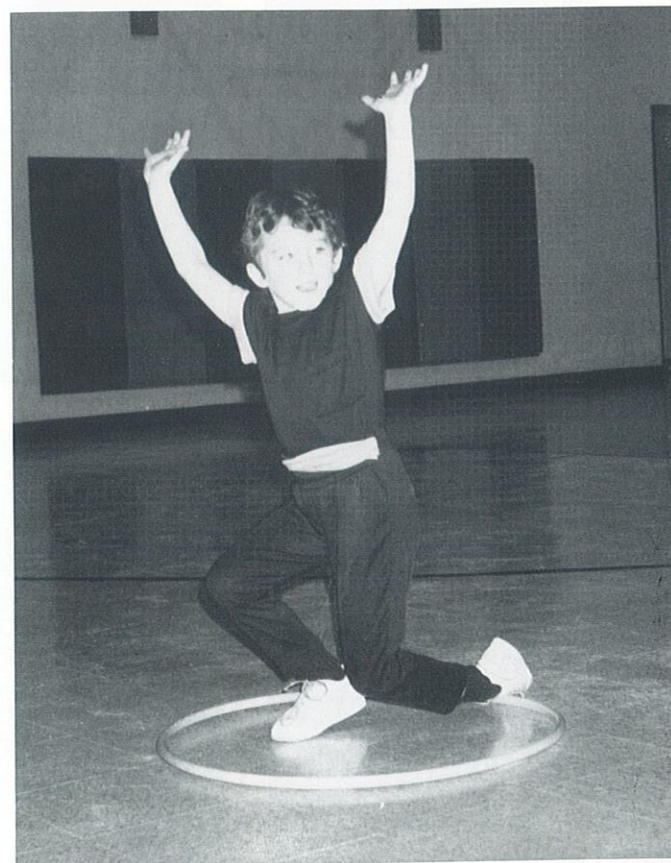
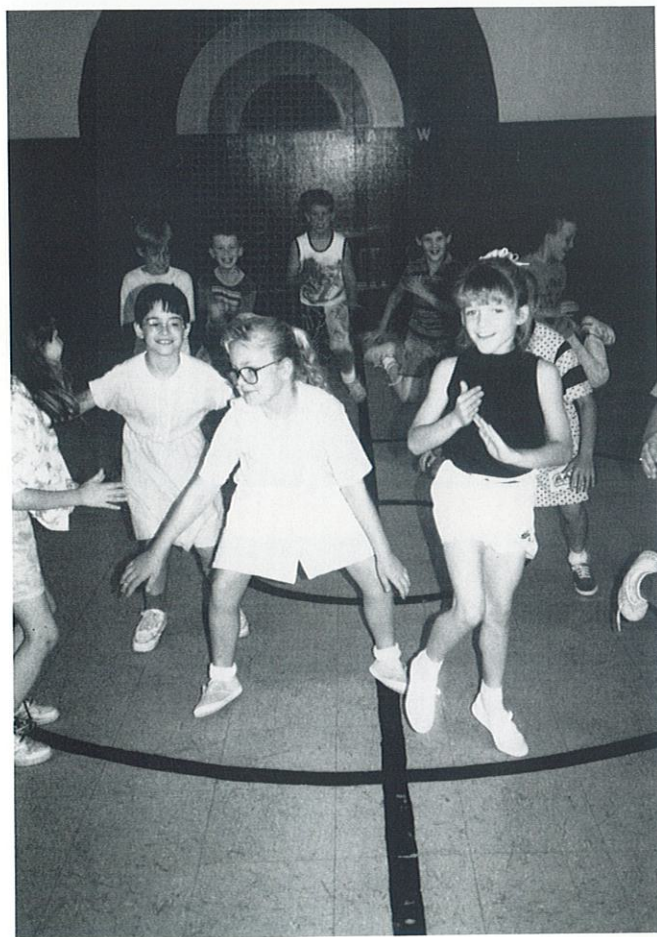

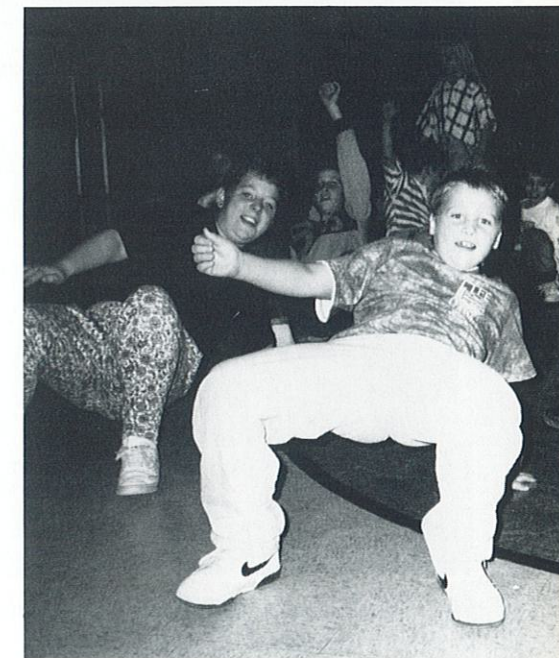

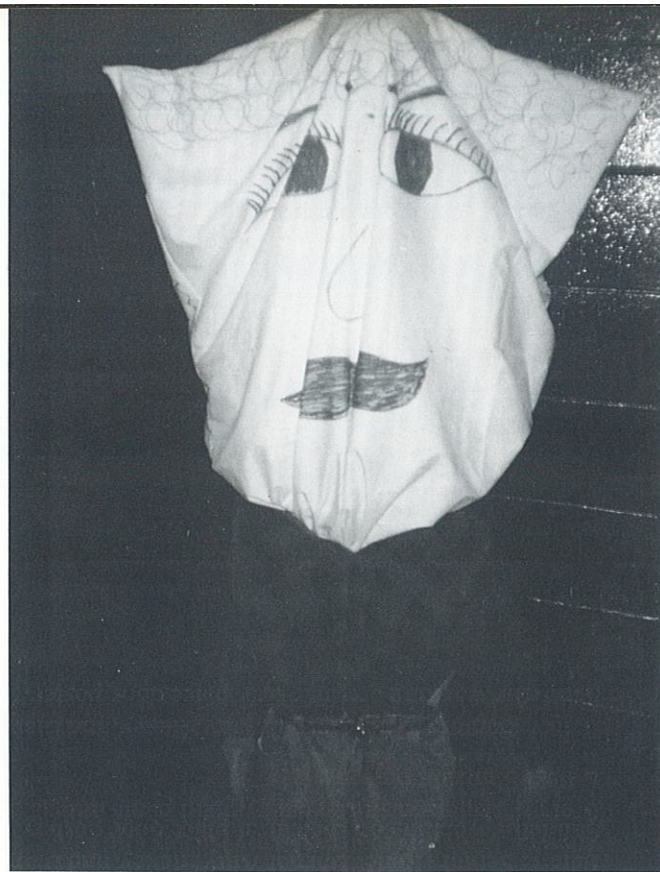

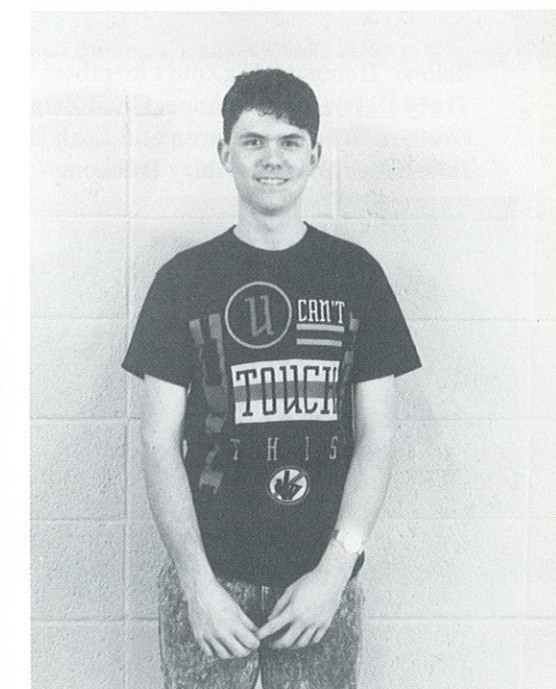

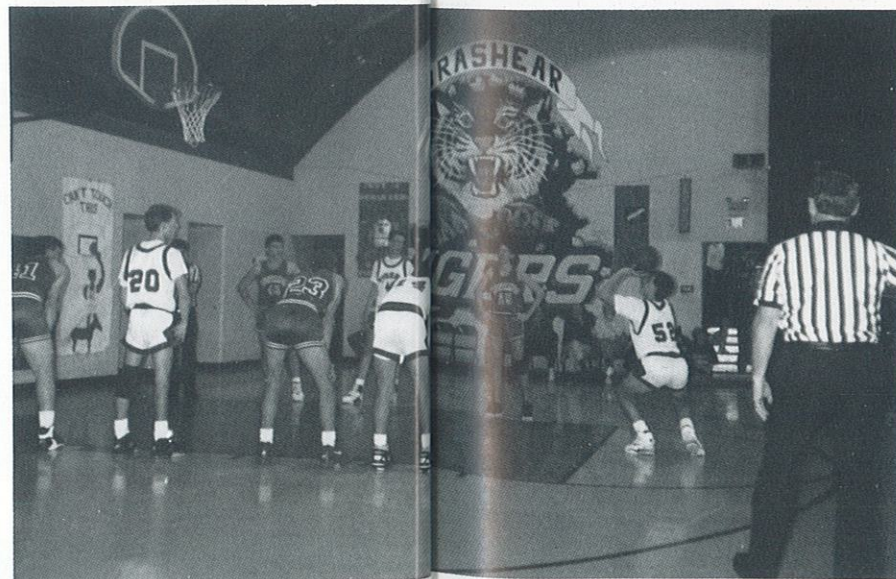

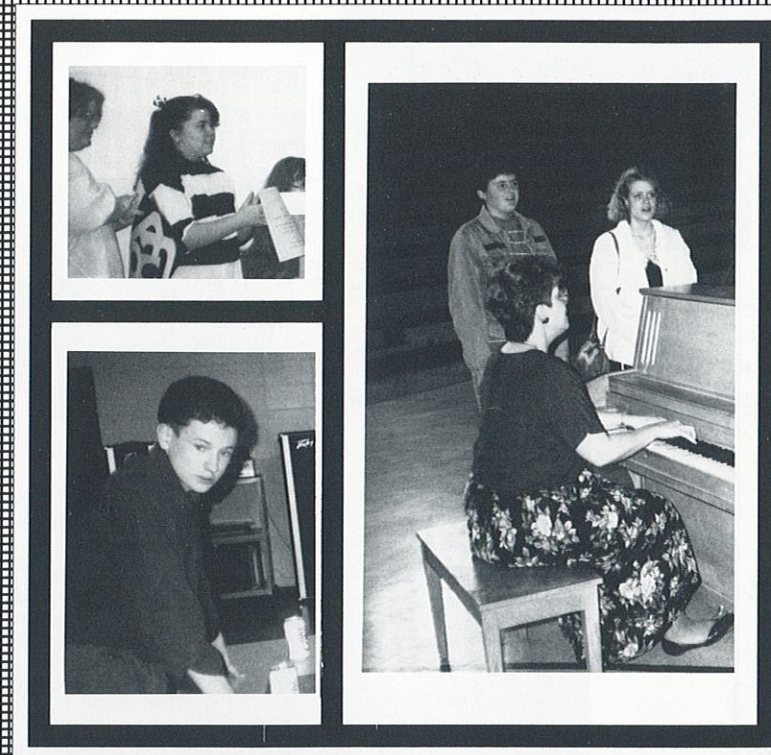

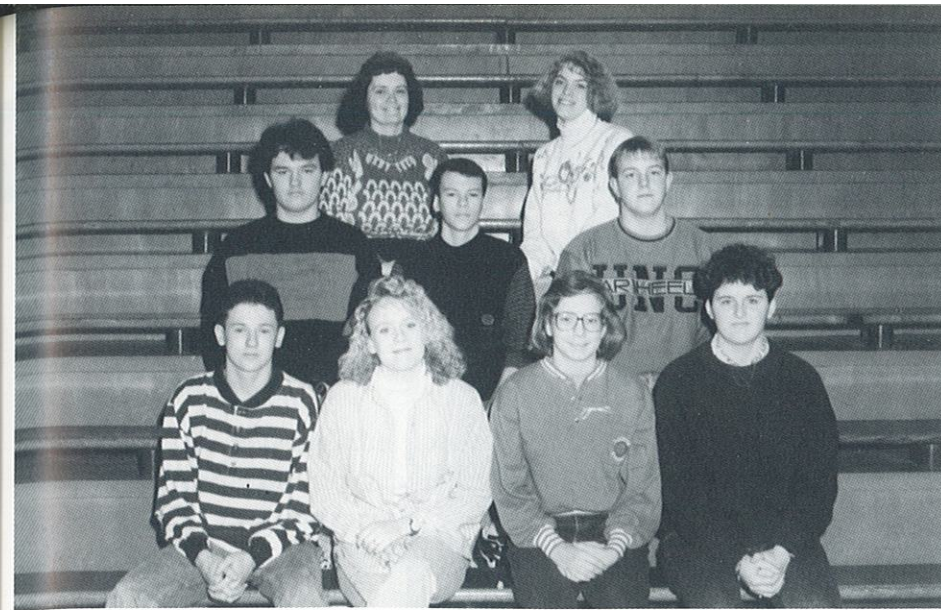

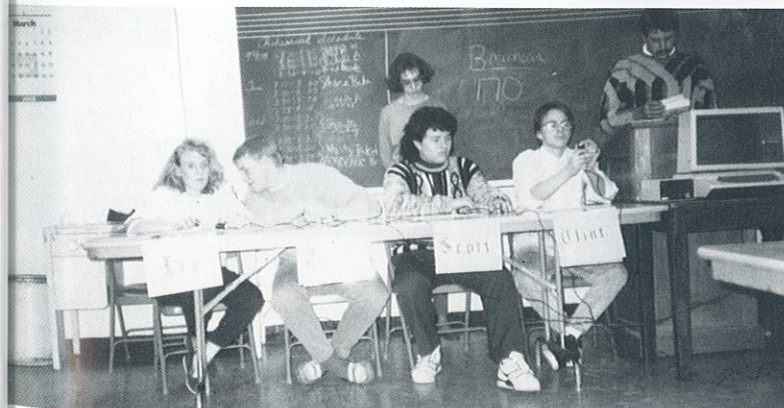

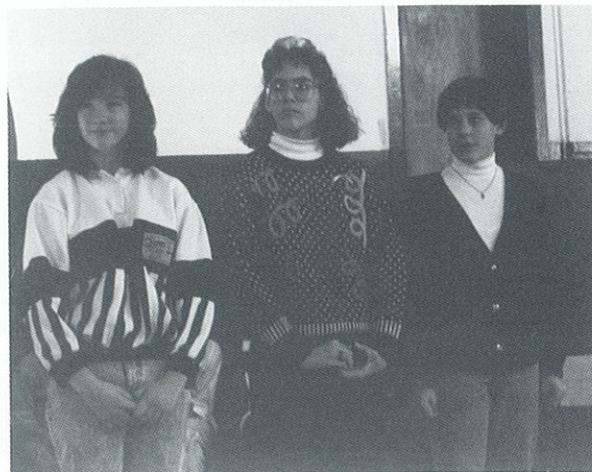

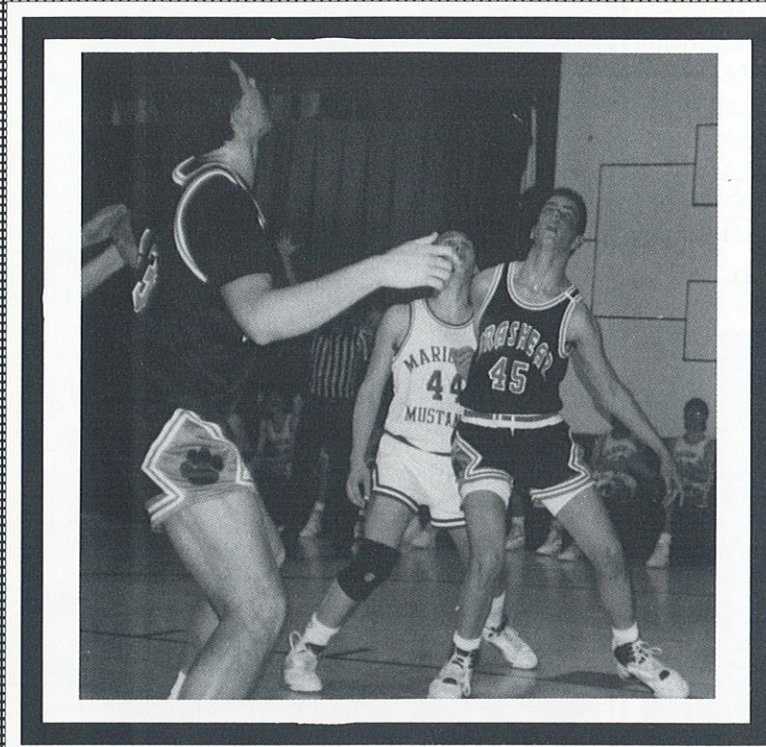

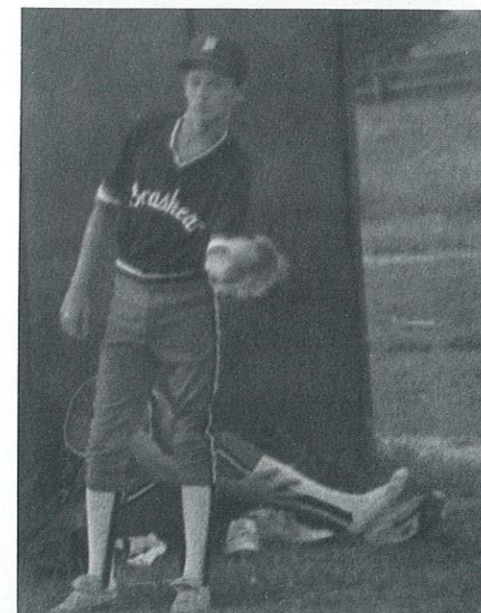

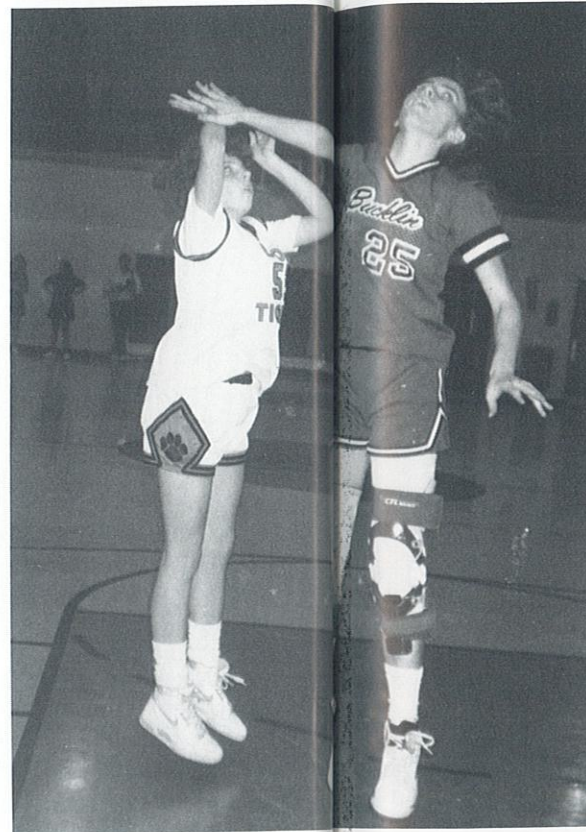

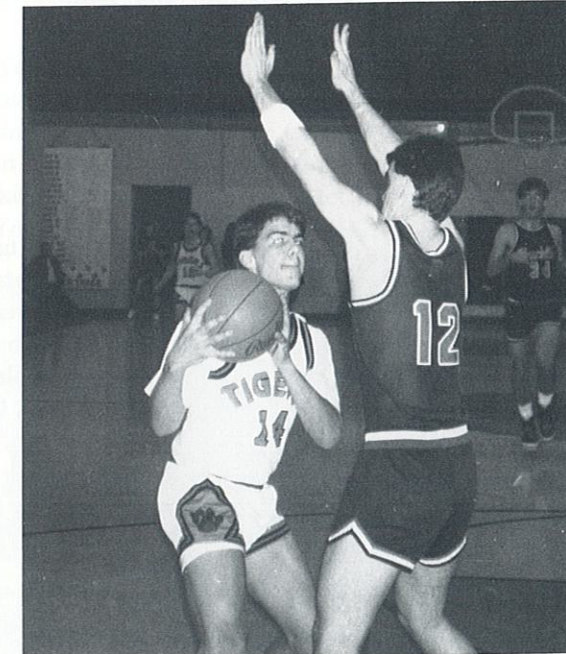

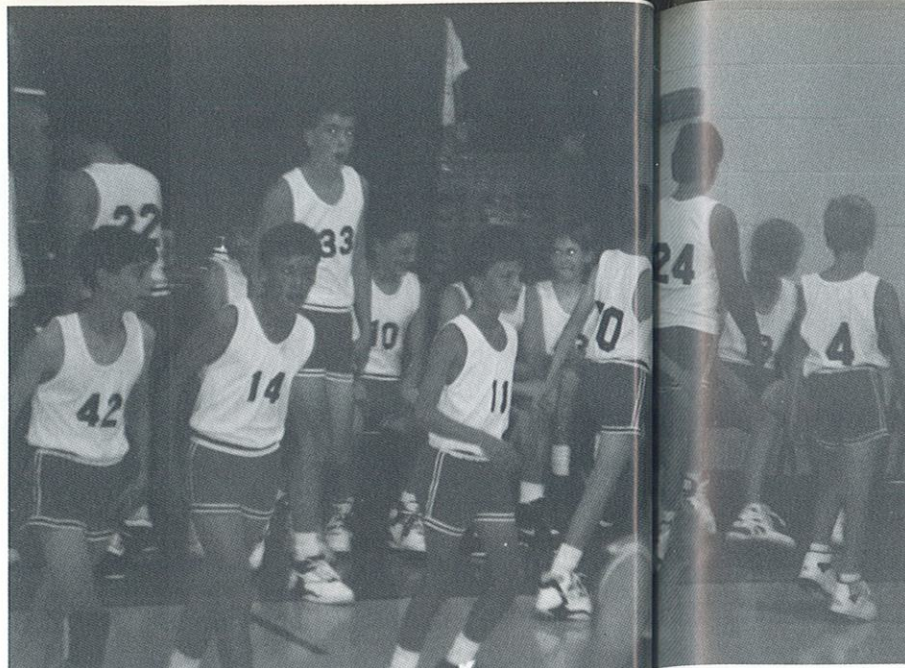

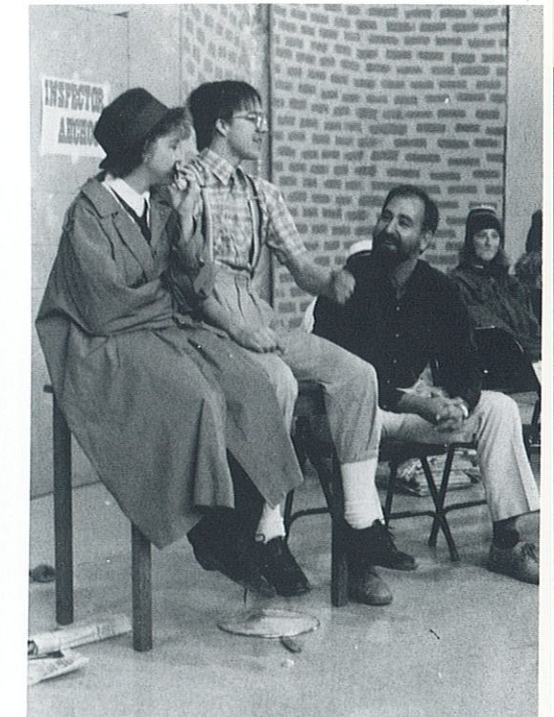

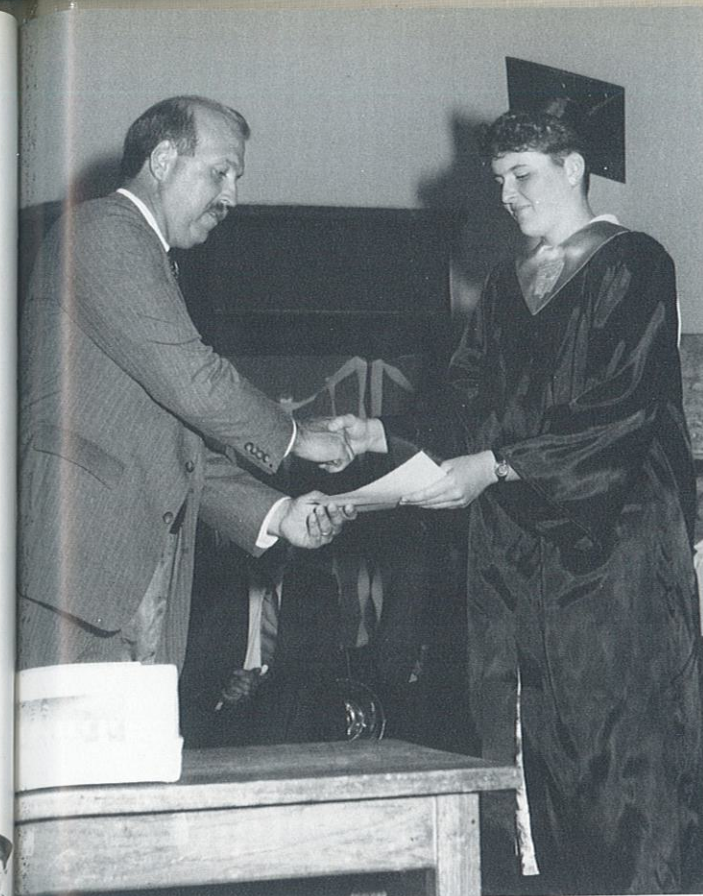

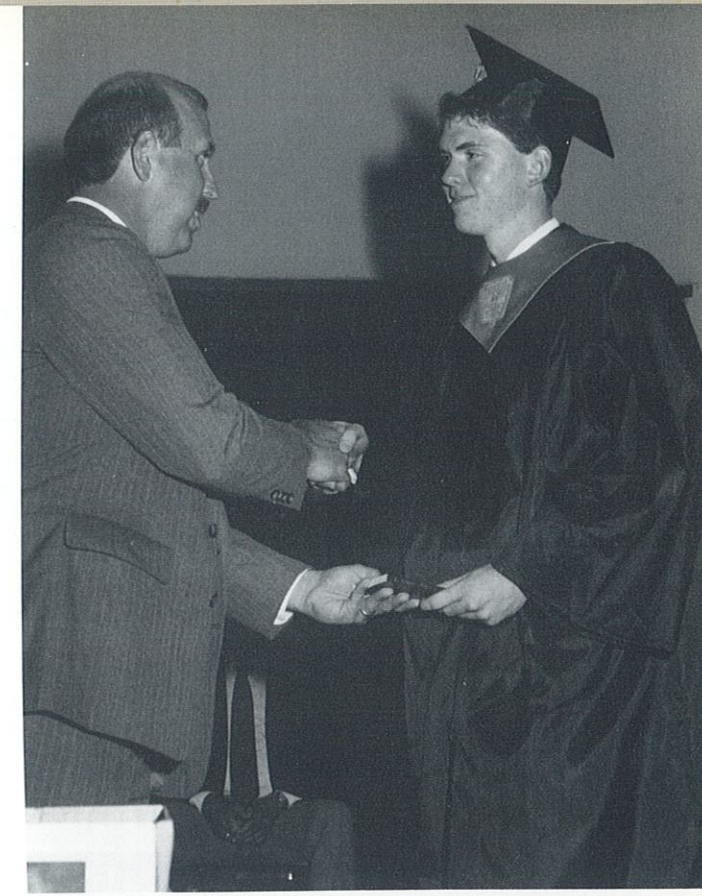


Left: Brad walking down the stairs after receiving his diploma from his father, school board member Gray Clark.

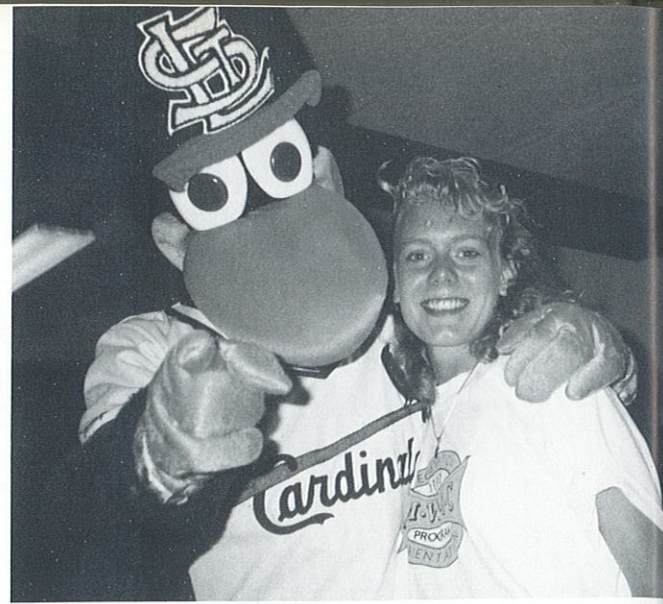

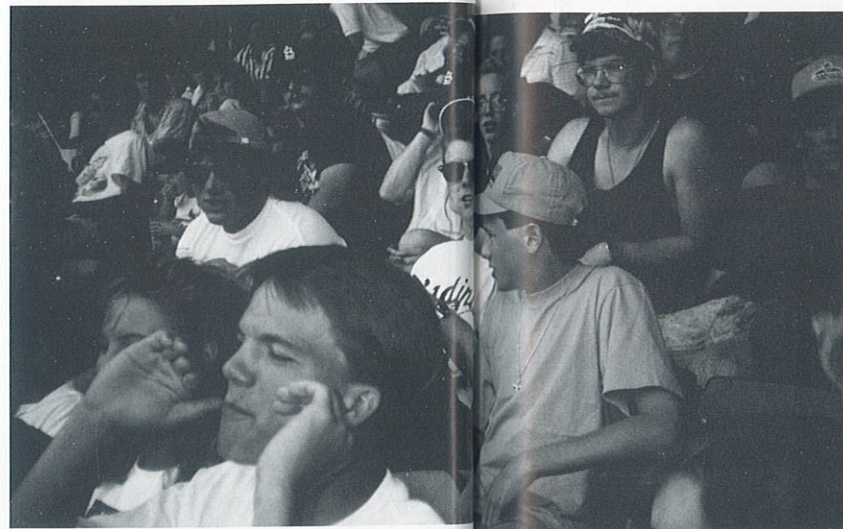

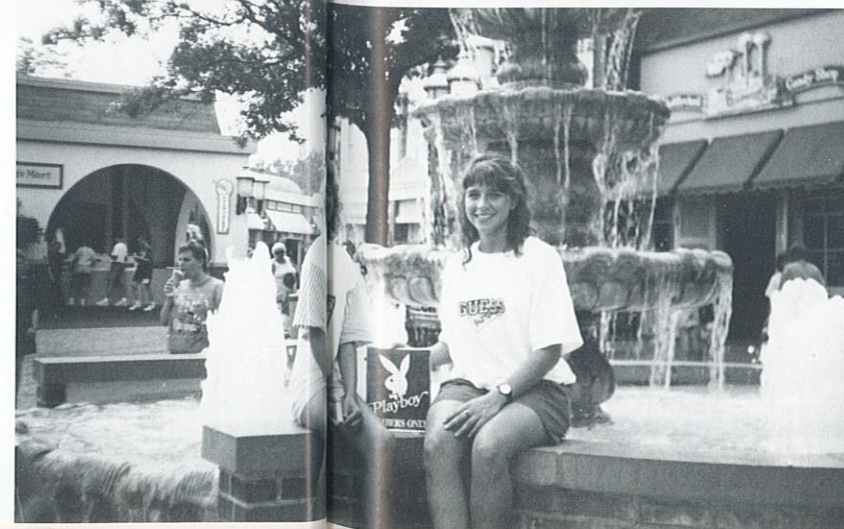
