The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education shared with us some very good news concerning student achievement.

They grouped school buildings into three categories - buildings with less than 250 students, buildings with 250 to 500 students, and buildings with more than 500 students. Adair Co. High School is in the Top 10 in the following content area(s): Communication Arts, Grade 7

and Science, Grade 7. Improvement is an ongoing process; and the data shows there is a positive difference in student performance. Adair Co. High School has been recognized for being in the Top 10 for increasing the combined percentage of students scoring in the Proficient and Advanced categories in Mathematics, Grade 8 and Mathematics, Grade 10.

This year we have had a few teacher changes: Todd

McClaskey is replaced with Michael Jennings as the science teacher. Micheal Jennings is also the varsity baseball coach and girls junior varsity/varsity basketball coach. Donald Snoozy comes back to be the math teacher, replacing Jill Ralph.

The high school has a new room called the At Risk Room. Students (K-12) may visit the At Risk Room for tutoring under the direction of Judy Owens and Charlene Fisher.

grade class this year, Sarah Falkingham, Michael Altum, and John Hicks. They were all excited that they had joined the third grade class.

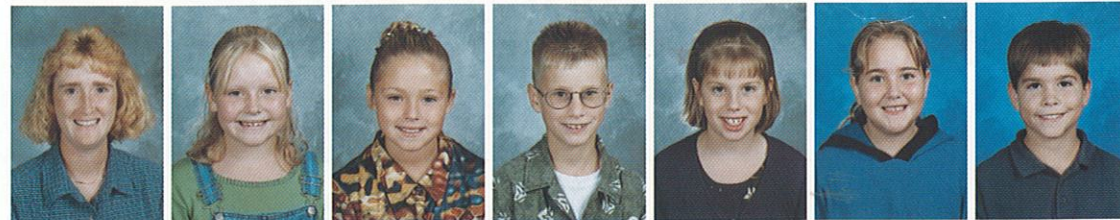
The third grade class was involved in the Wee Deliver program. The students wrote letters to students in the elementary and received letters also.



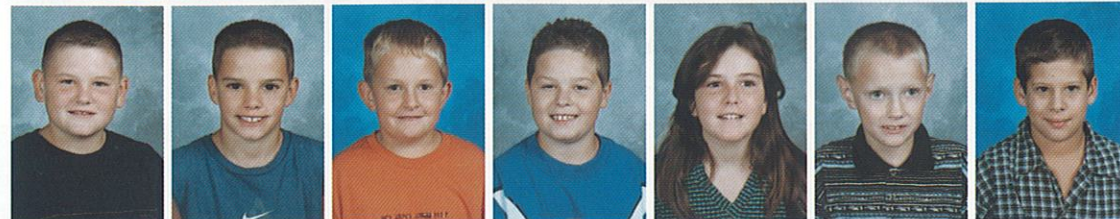

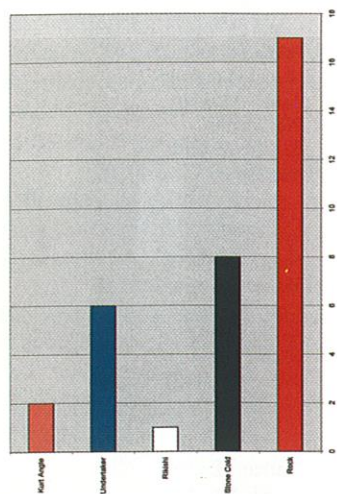

The sophomore class has participated in many activities this year, most of which are centered around college and careers.

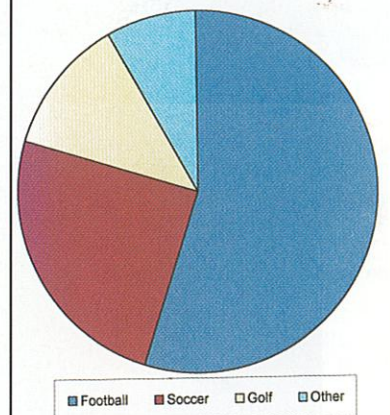

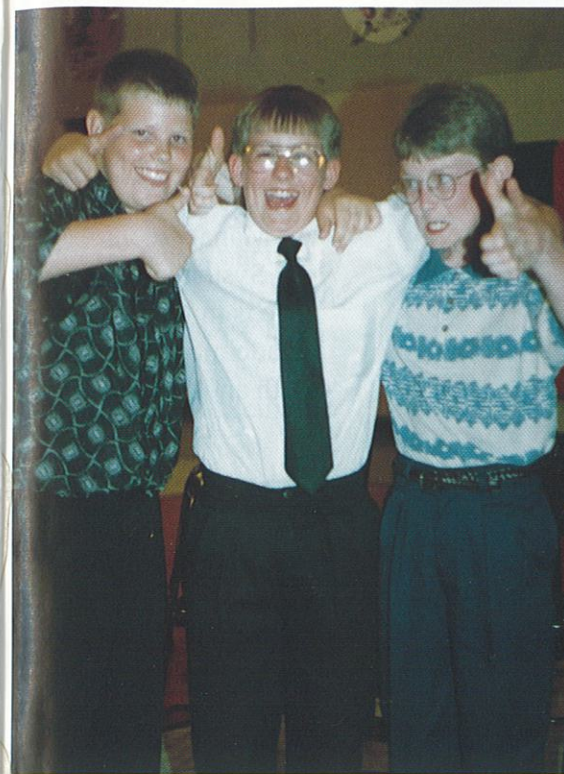
## The Class Of 2001

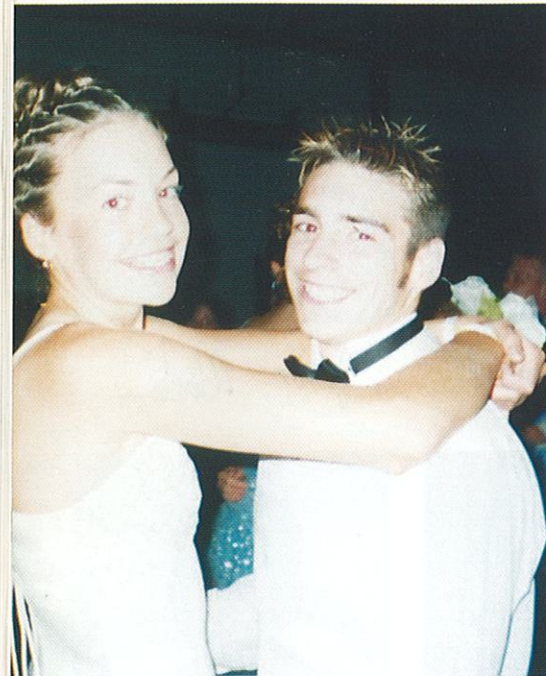

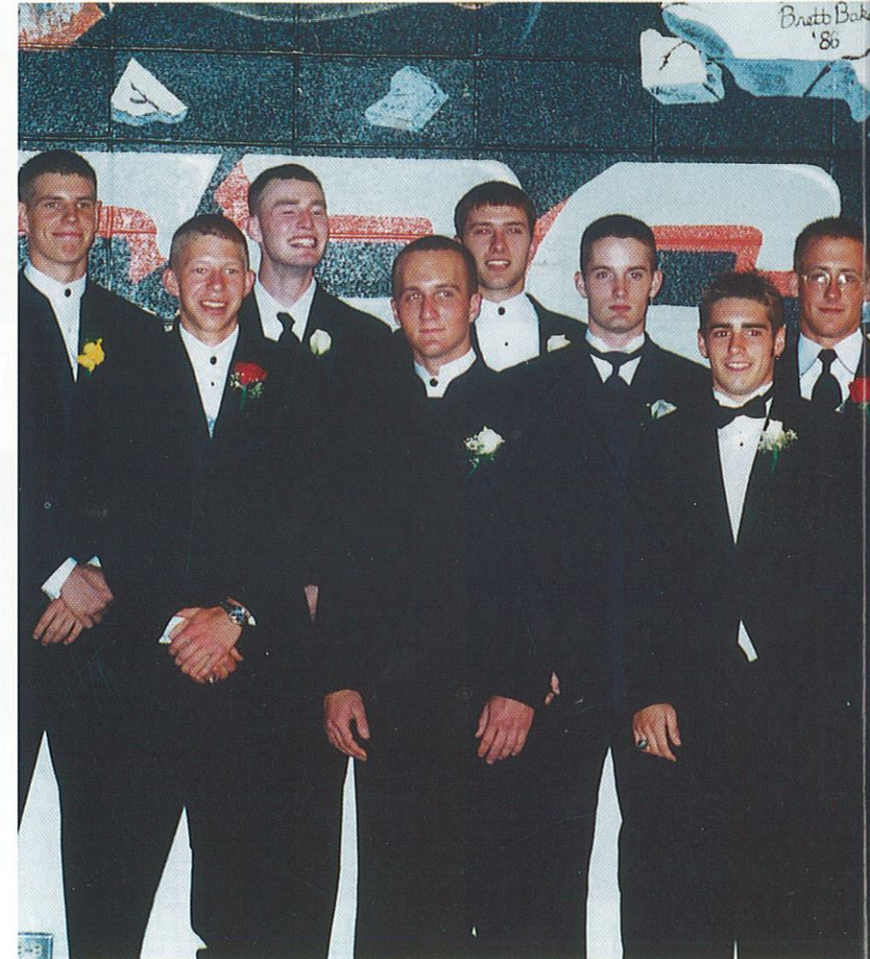

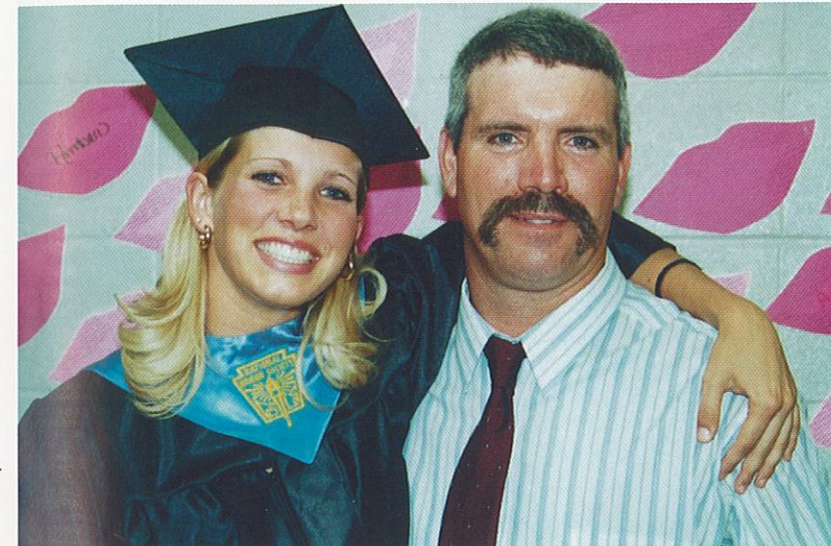

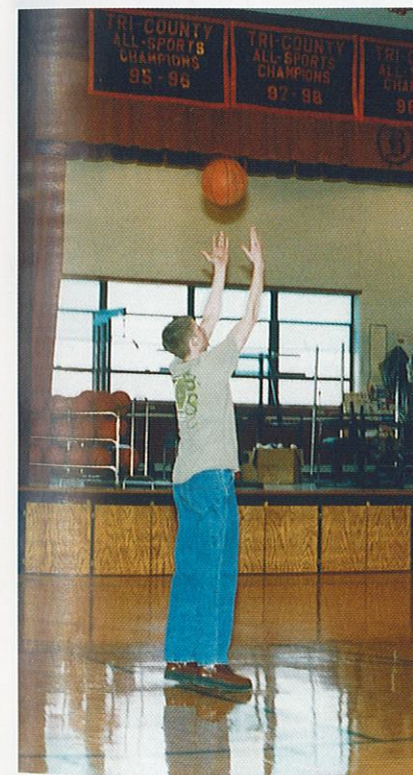

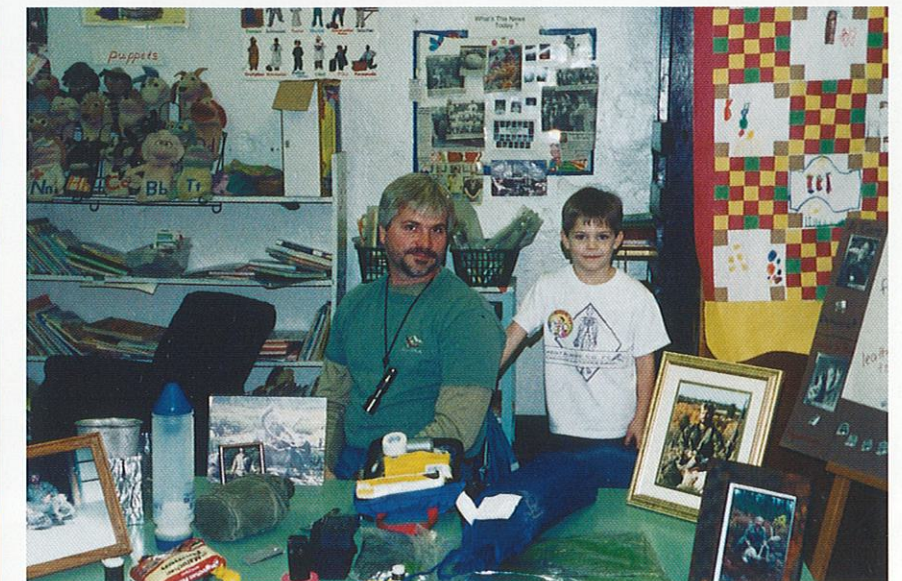

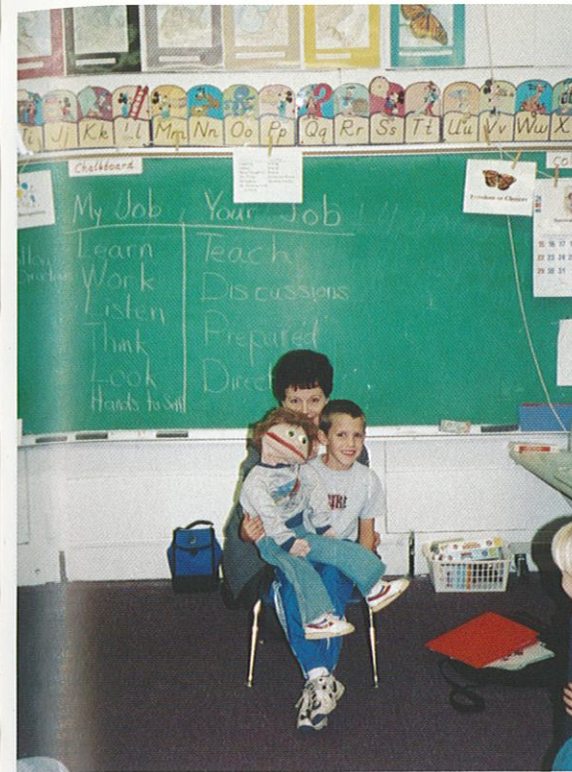

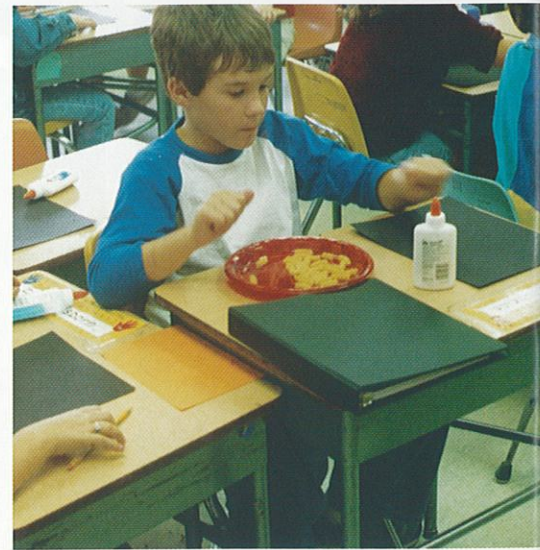

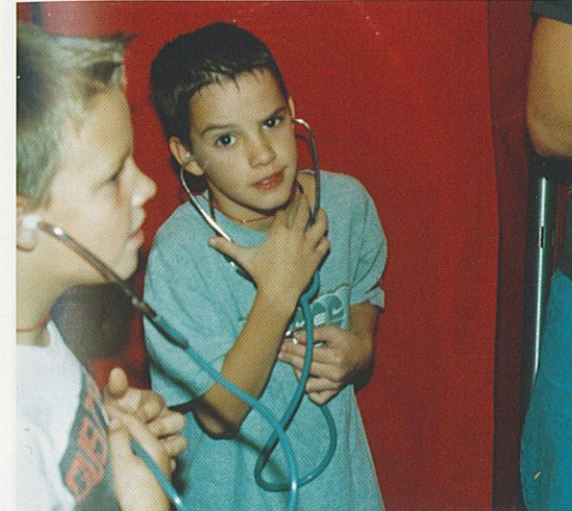

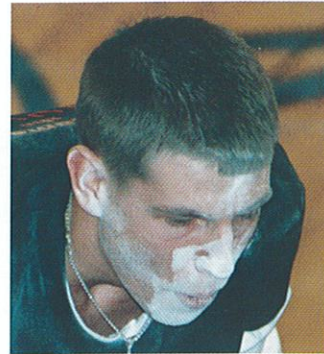

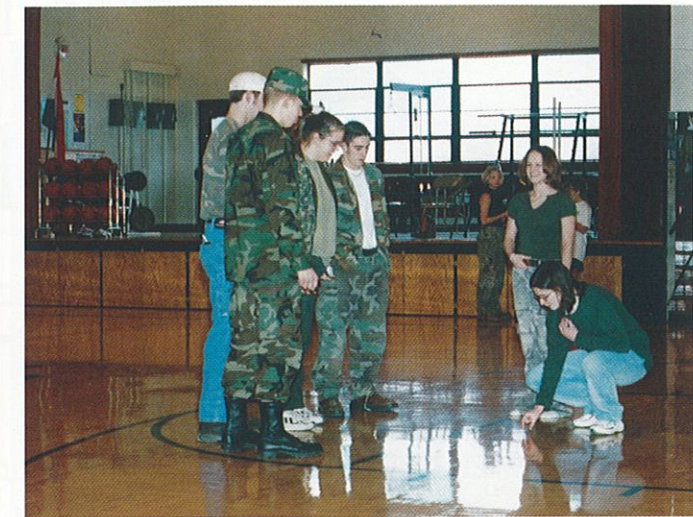

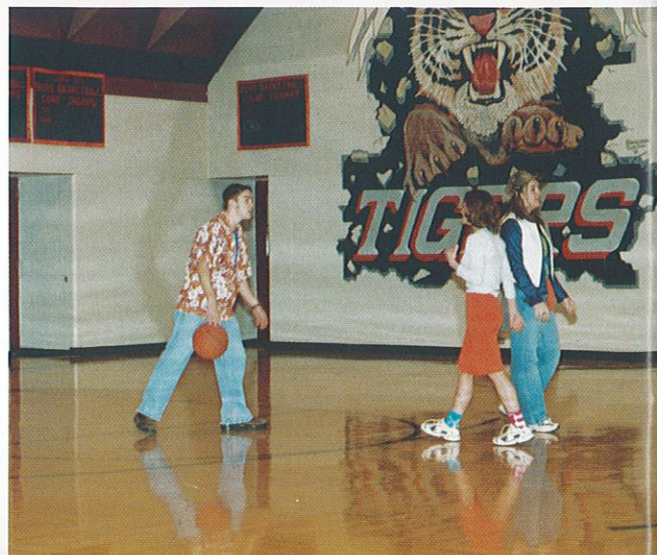

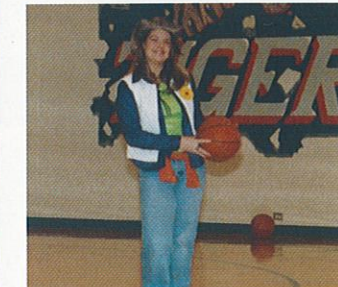

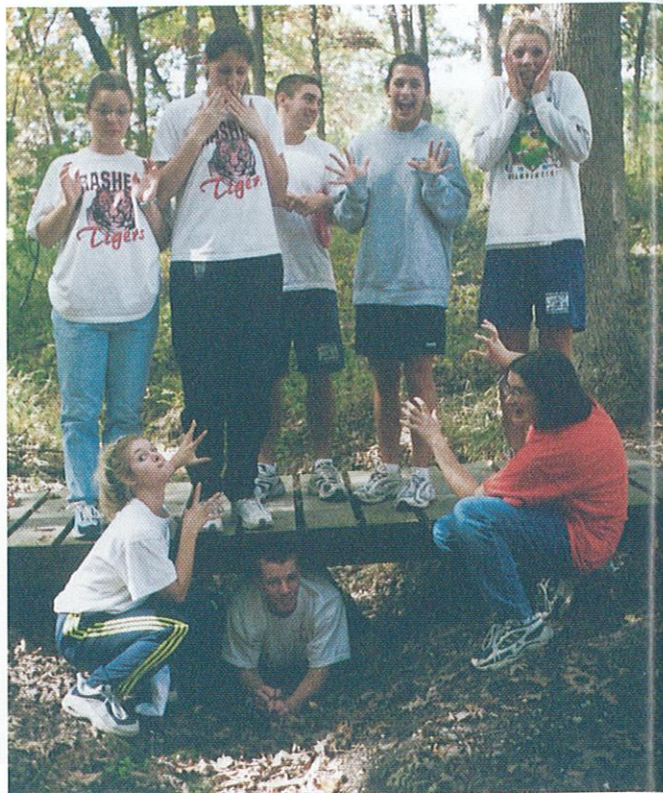

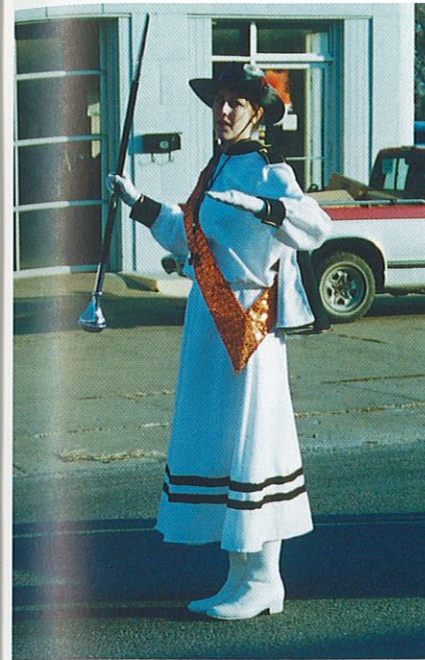

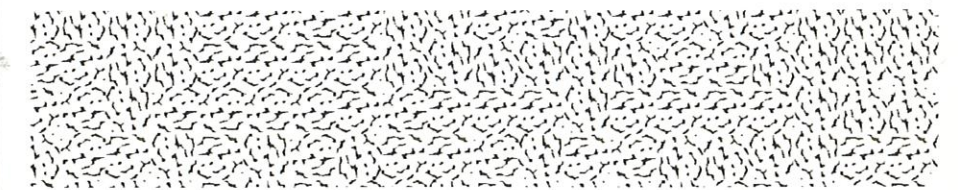

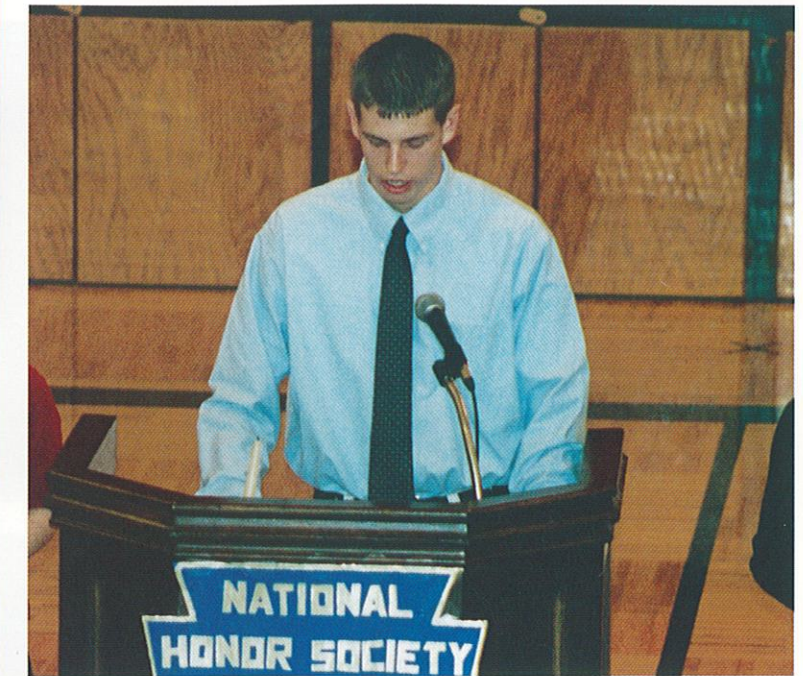

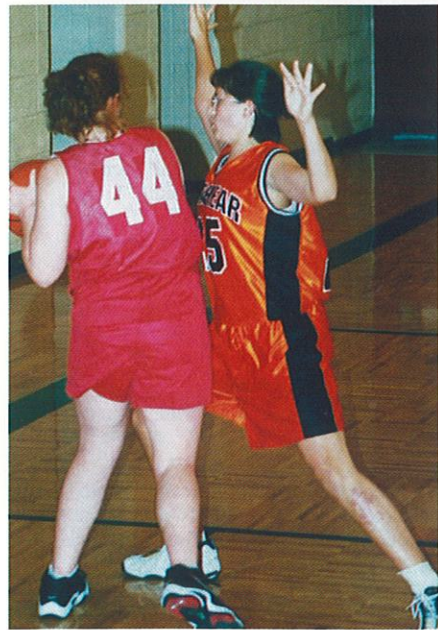

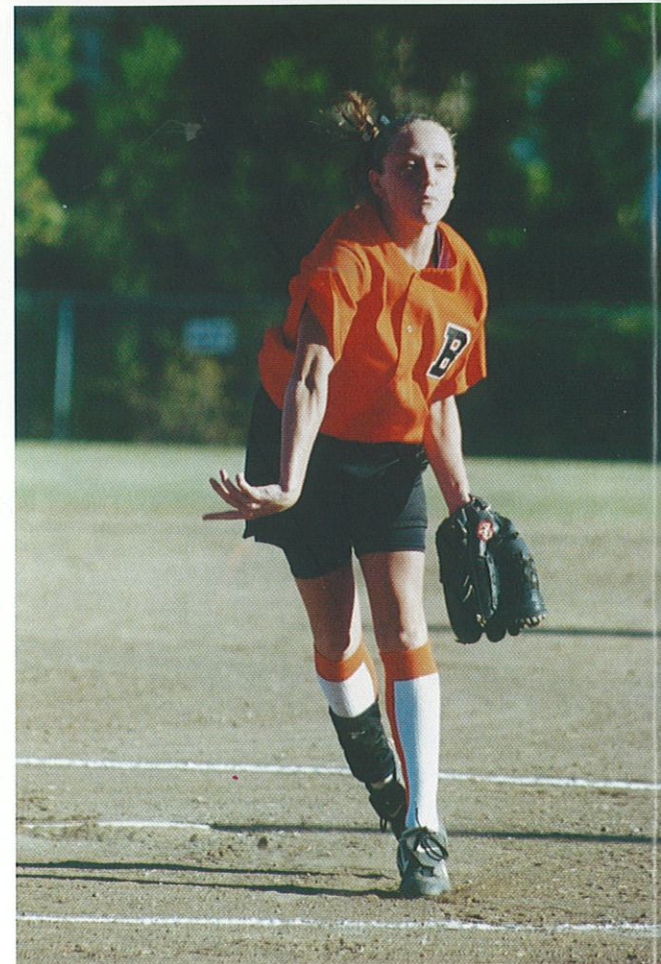

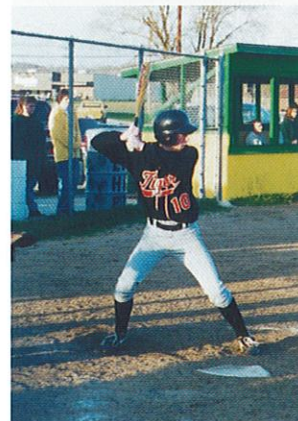

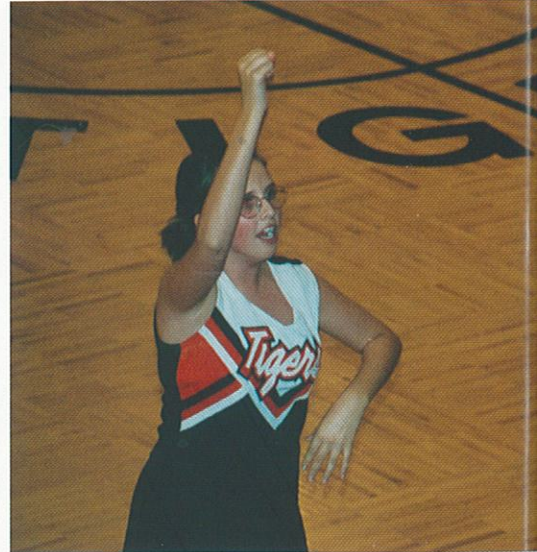

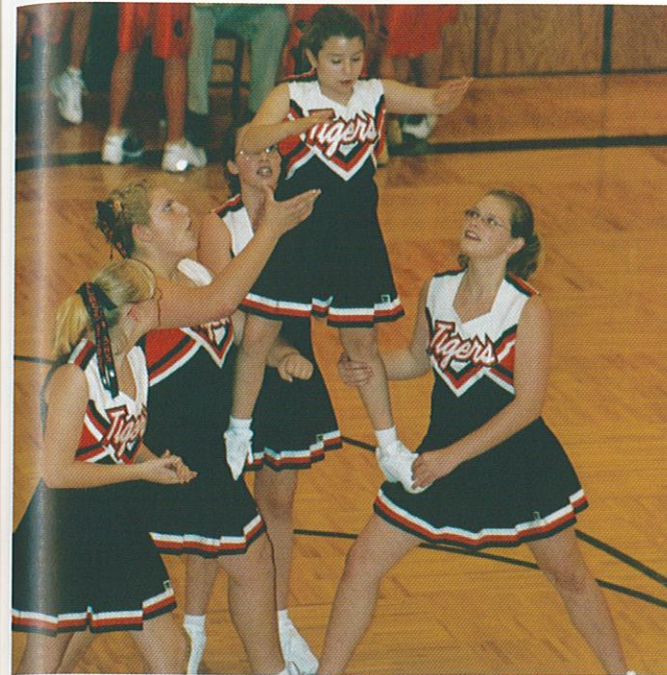

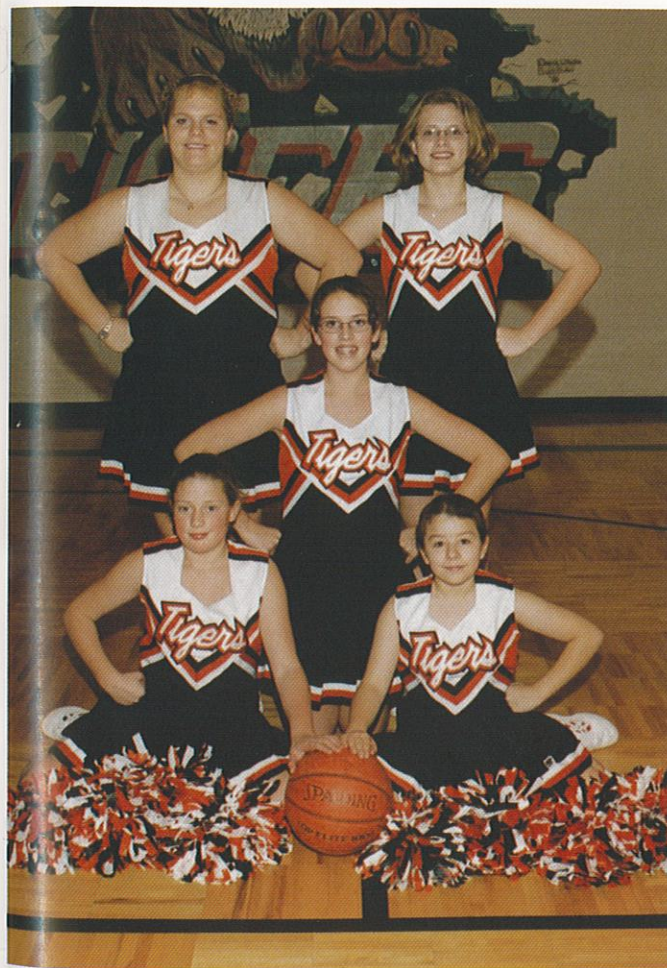

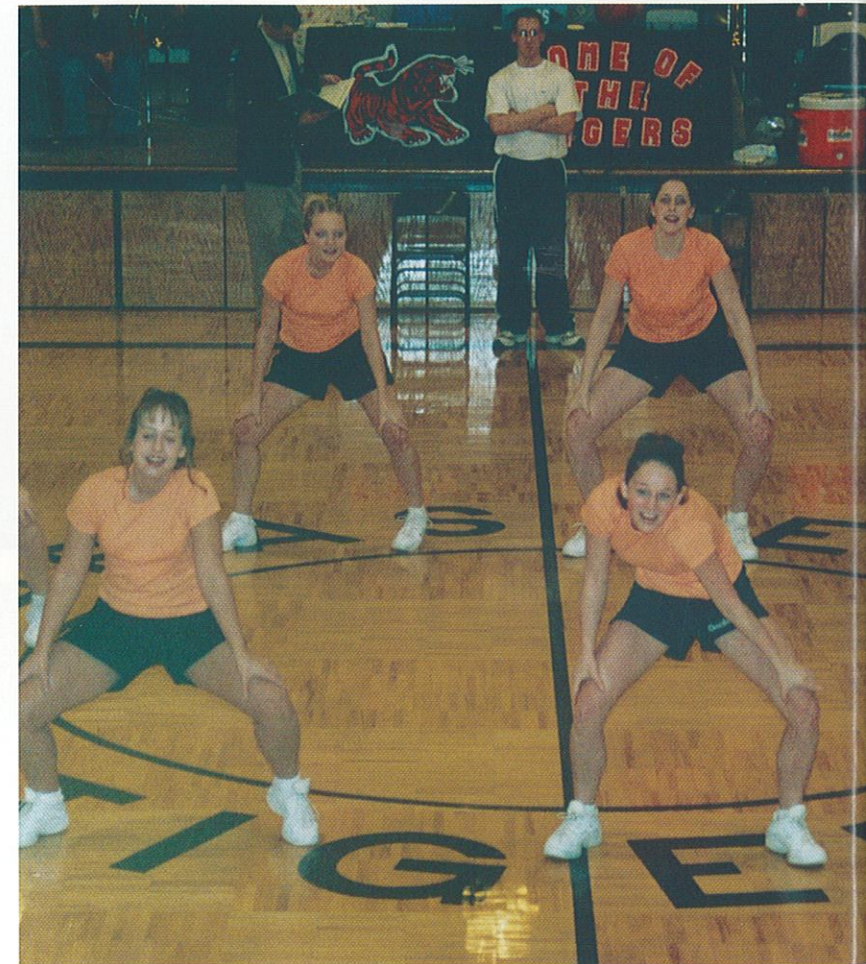

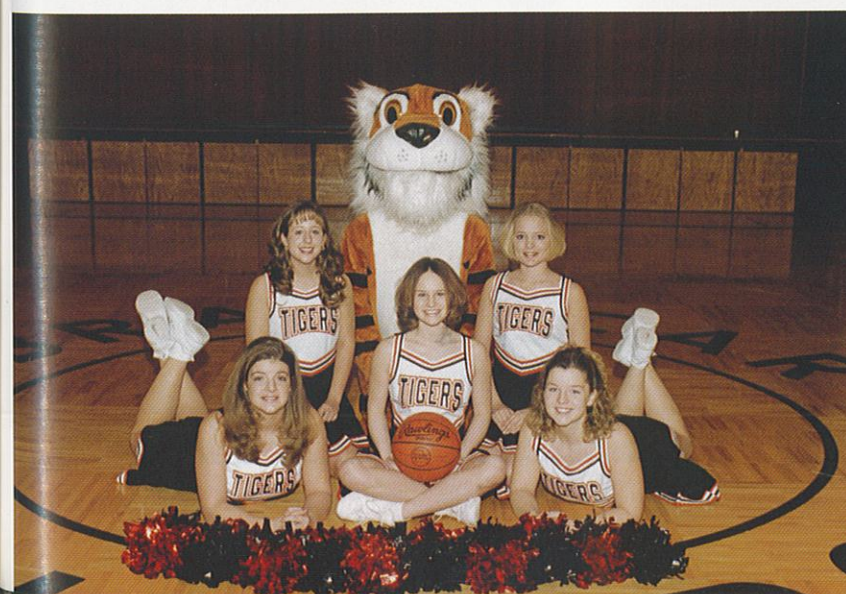

The Lady Tigers defeated Green City 45 to 38 in first round district play. The Atlanta Hornets defeated Brashear Tigers in the next district game.

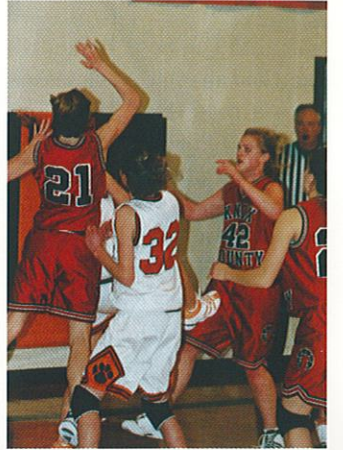
