
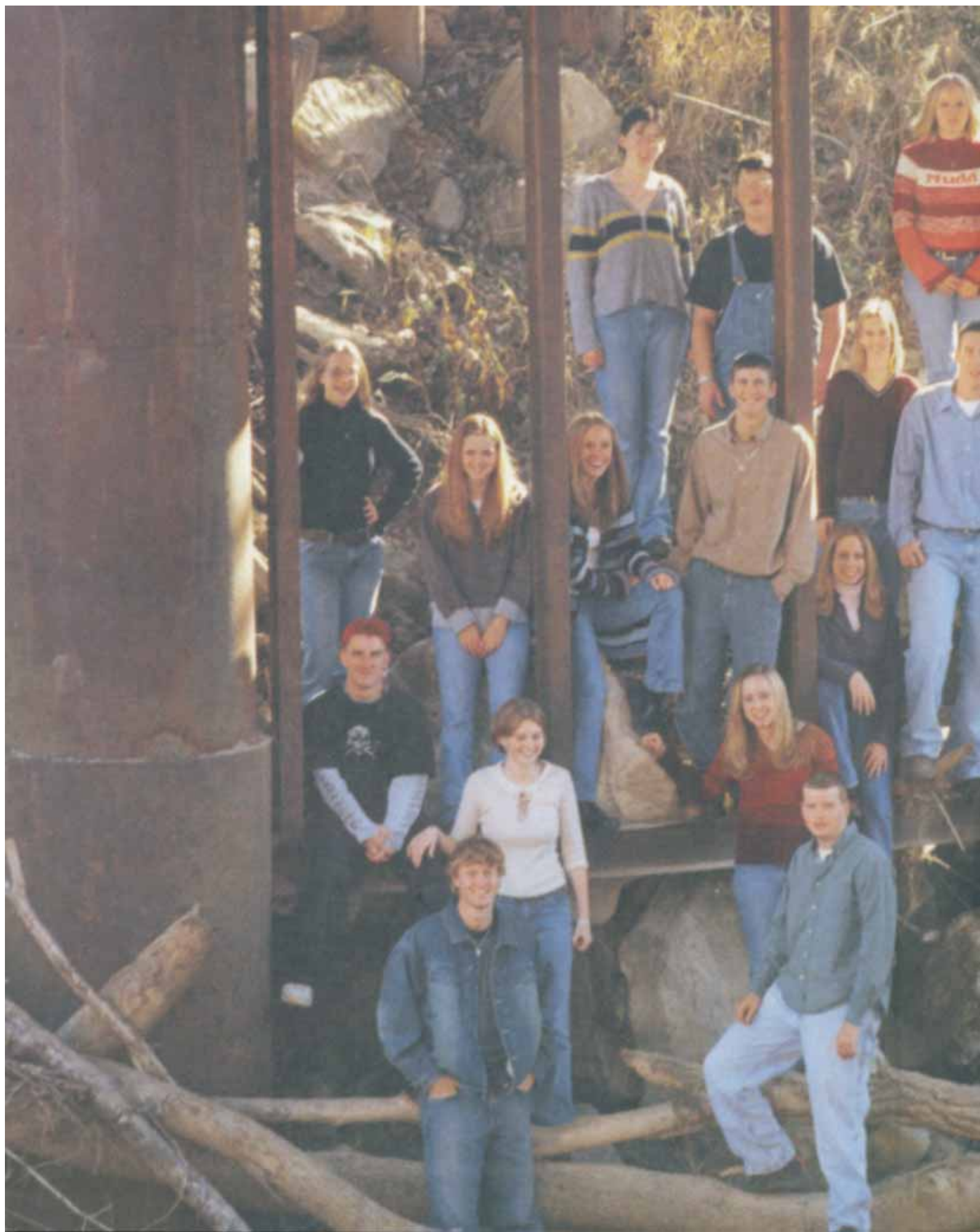

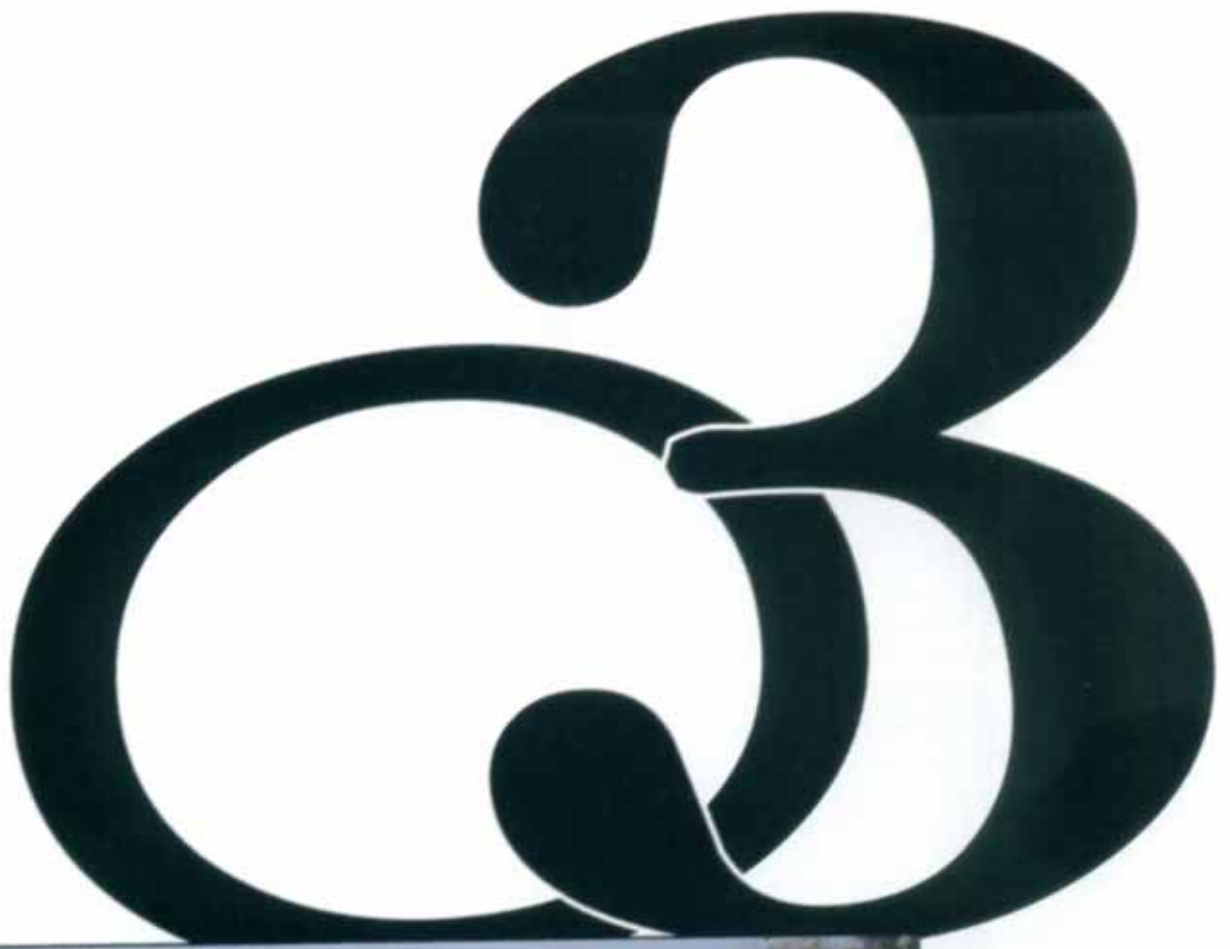

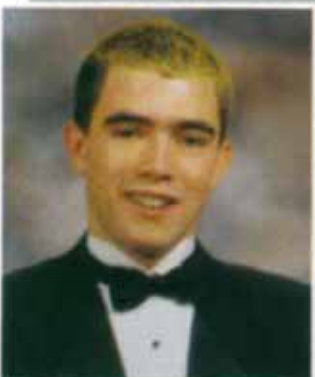

venture. The students went on a Dino Dig, studied weather and seasons, checked temperatures in different locations, kept a weather calendar, conducted a condensation experiment, and tried to melt chocolate using the sun's heat. The room was very busy with

visitors talking to the students about a wide variety of careers.

**Second grade** had an exciting year. They started the year off reading *Even Steven* and *Odd Todd* and retold *Millions of Cats*. Students also studied different animals and their habitats this year. The First Thanksgiving was the second graders' first play this year. They presented a reader's theater to first grade and

enjoyed eating apples. In science they learned about the world of bats and other flying mammals. During the year, second graders constructed a dinosaur of their choice and wrote about the dinosaur they chose. Each student also read a different version of the *Gingerbread Man*, in celebration of Christmas. Students also learned new vocabulary words such as mineral, igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary and they celebrated the 100th day of school on January 30.

## Third Grade

The third grade embarked on a journey through the fantasy world of fairy tales. They read and discussed common themes of fairy tales and once finished, wrote a fairy tale of their own. They were given the opportunity to create monsters to cause havoc. In math they discussed addition and subtraction strategies as well as multiplication and division facts. In addition to math and reading they talked about the earth, moon, and sun in science. They learned that the earth rotates just as the sun and moon does. Students analyzed what factors contribute to a community taking shape and made posters to show the location, culture, and geography of our community.

As the year progressed, students read biographies of various famous people, wrote a research paper on those people, and then presented their reports to the class. In math students have moved on to working with money. They learned how to add and subtract dollar amounts and will soon be calculating tax. In their rainforest unit in science, they created a rainforest in the classroom. They learned about plants and animals within a rainforest and how important rainforests are to us. In social studies, students discussed the reasons people move to different communities and why people immigrate to the United States.

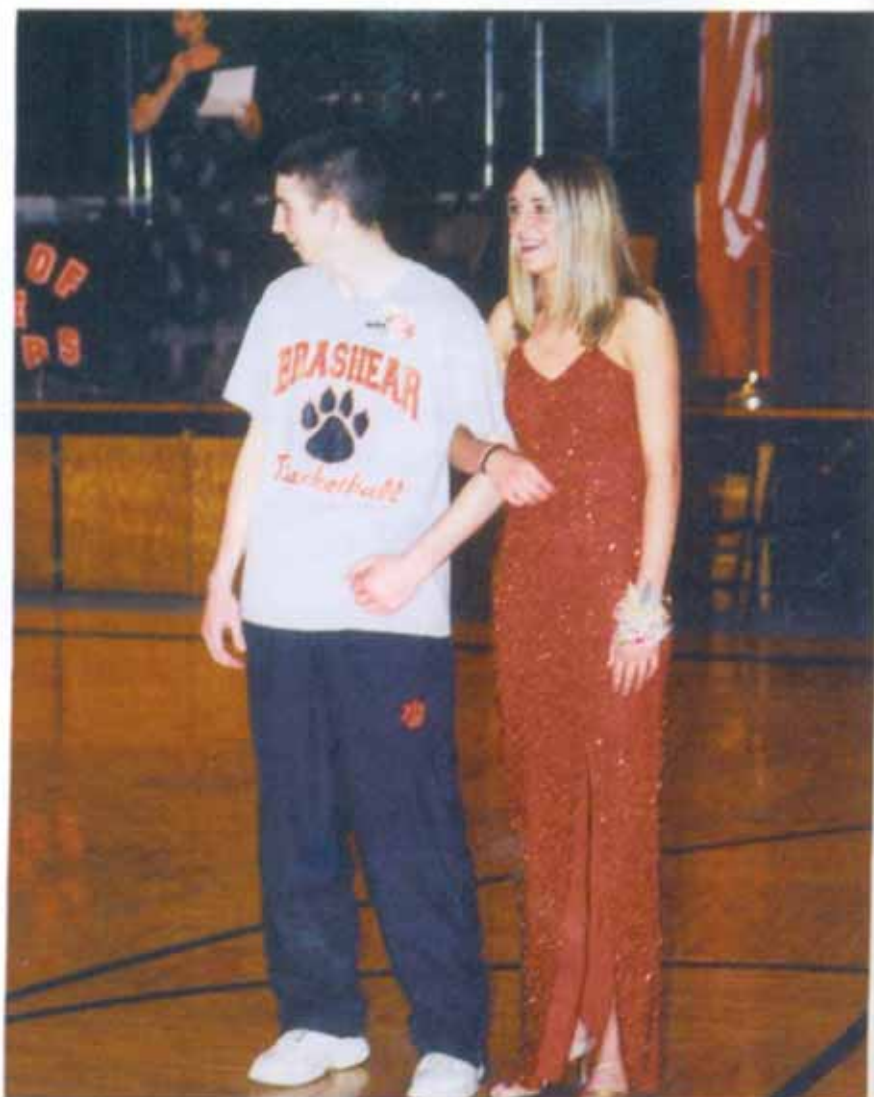

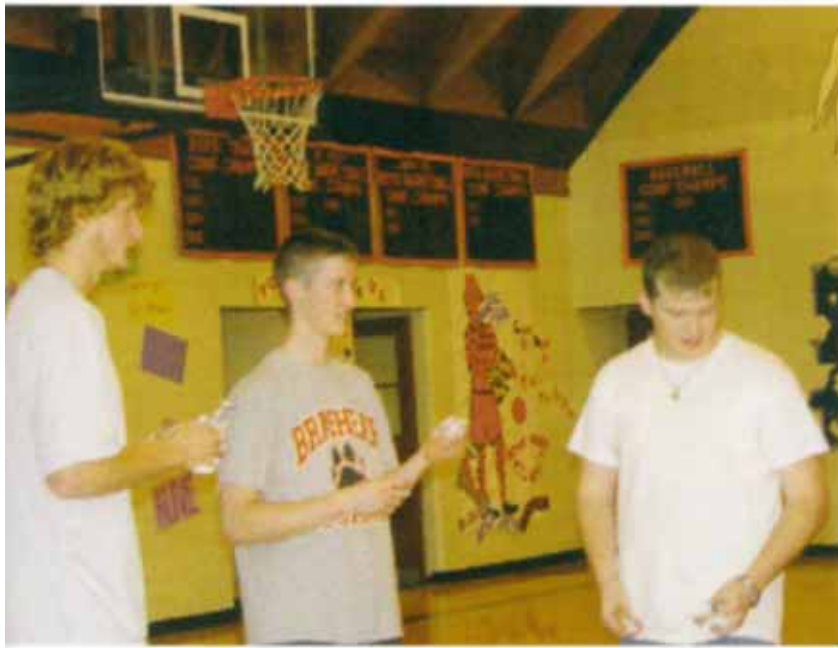

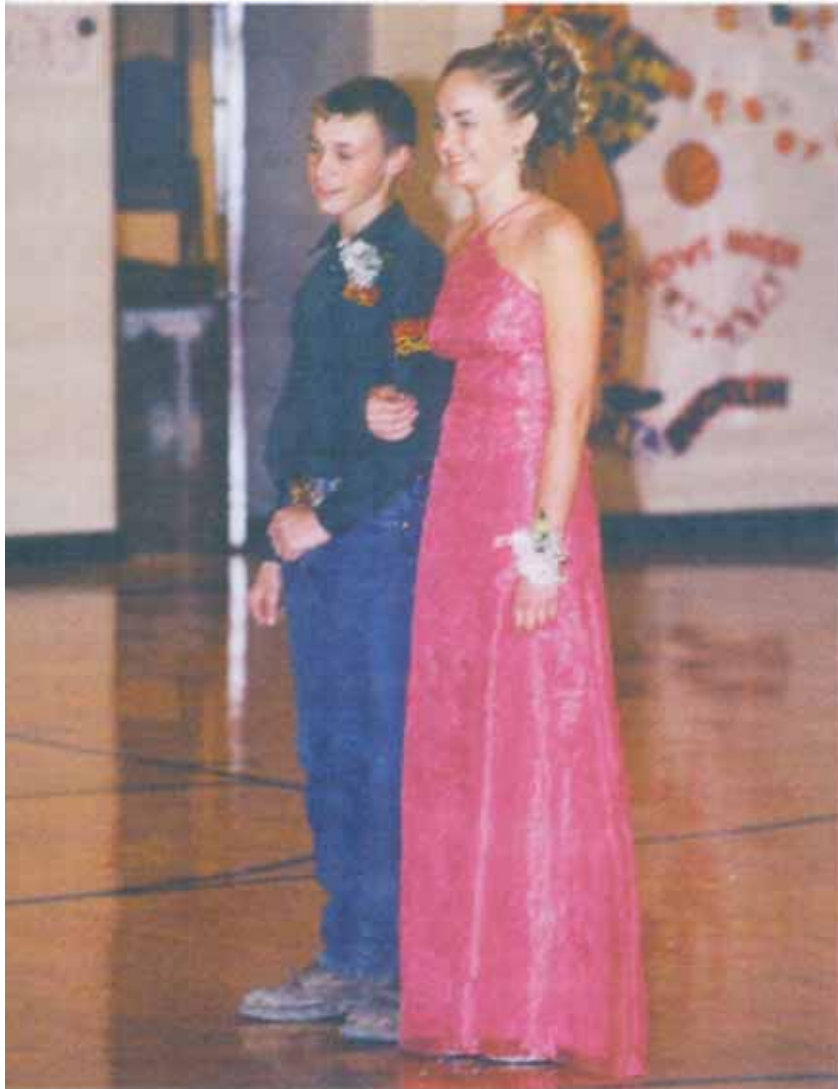

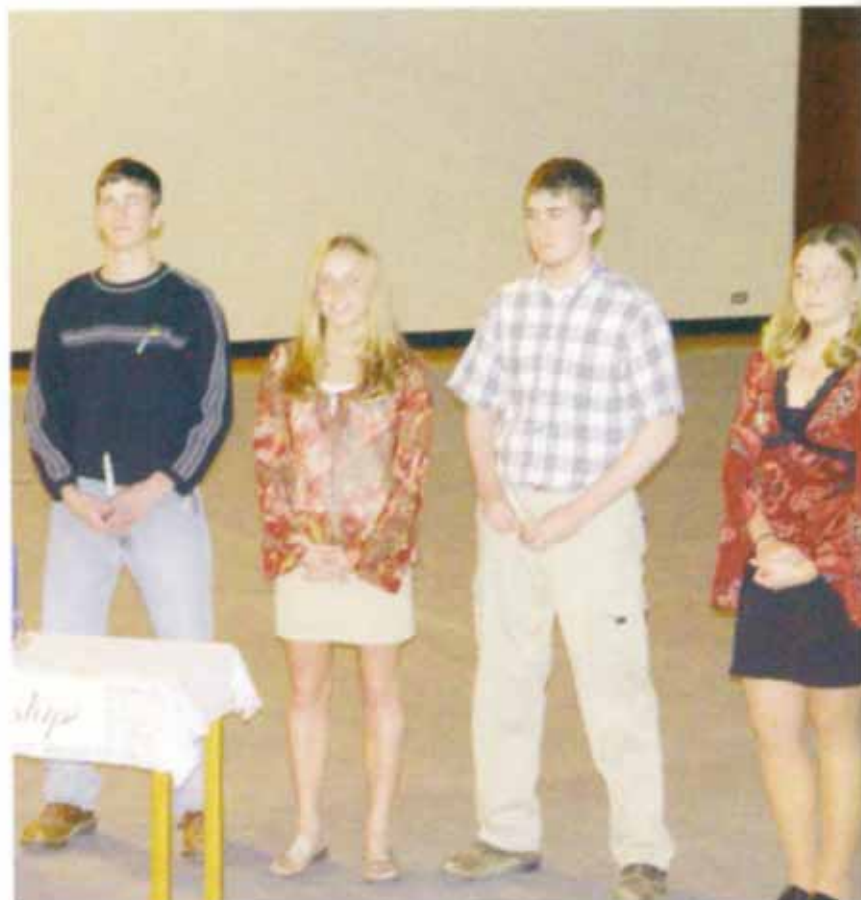

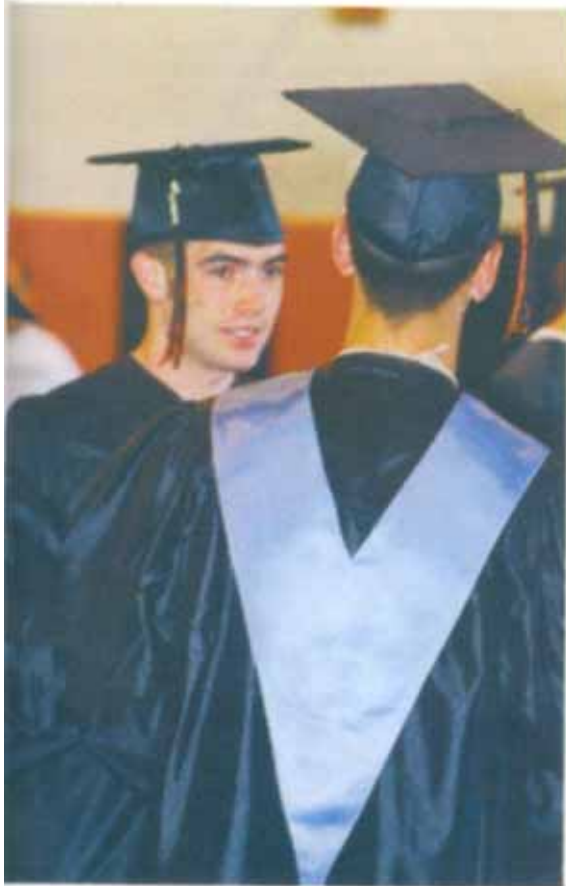
