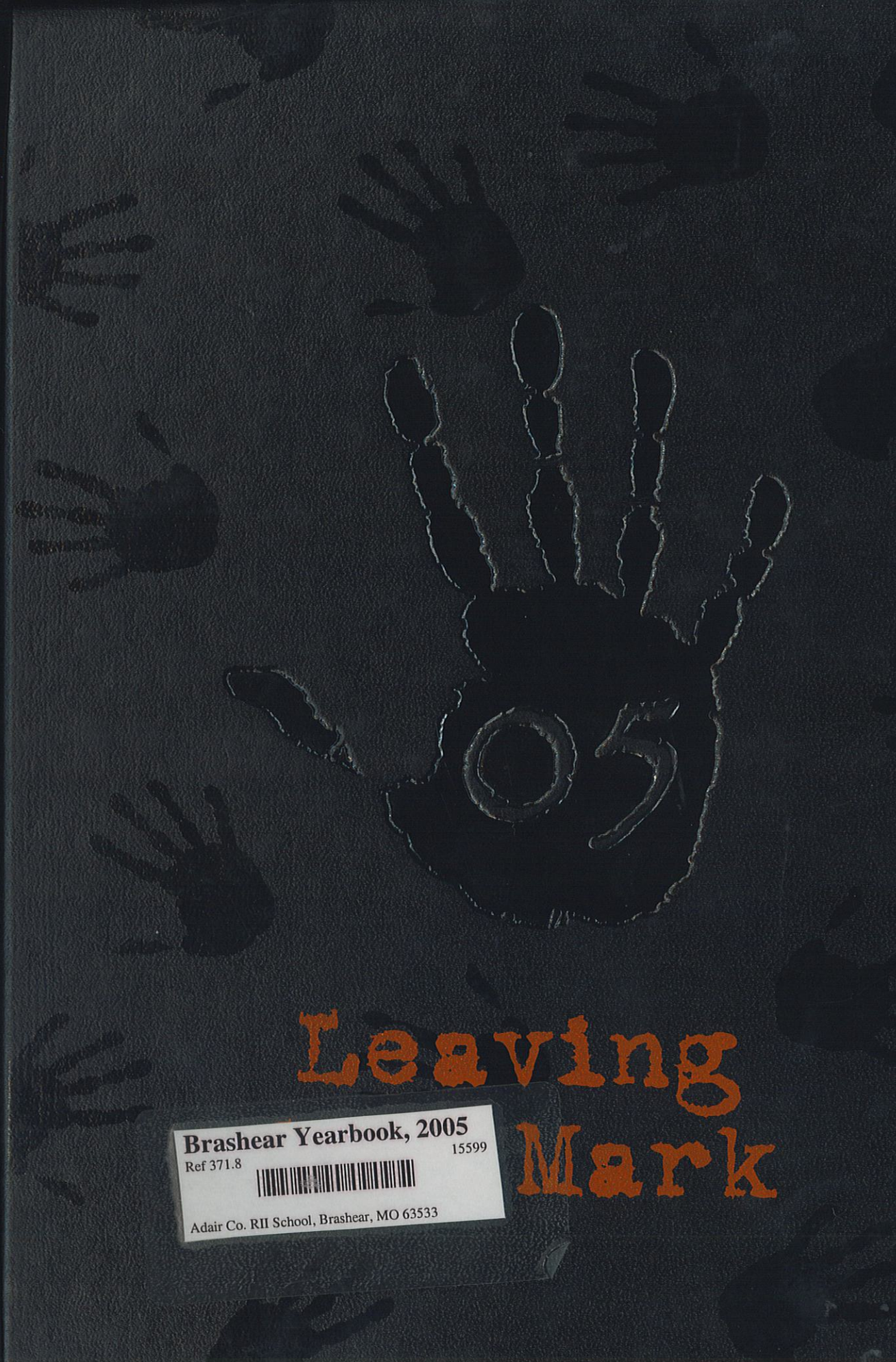

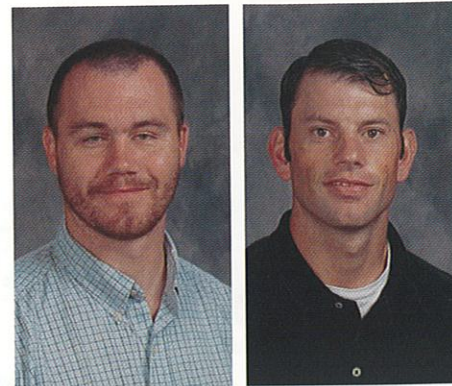
## New Faces Grace the Halls

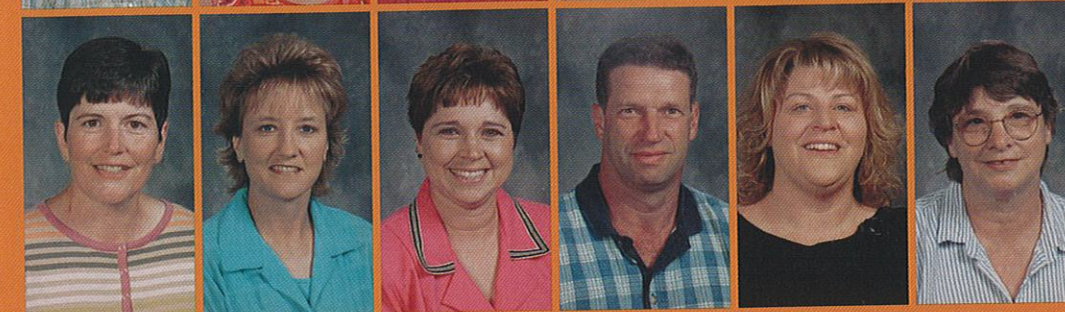

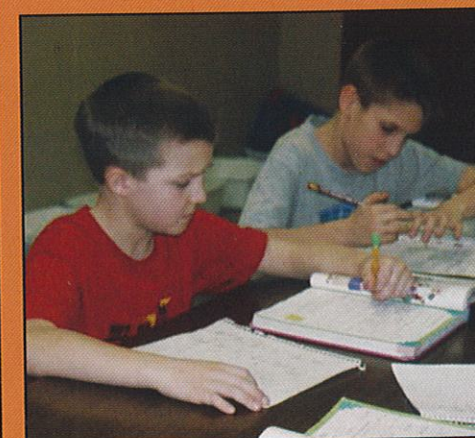

The purpose of the program is to create community-learning centers that provide academic enrichment opportunities for children to meet state and local student standards in core academic subjects, to offer students a broad array of enrichment activities that can complement their regular academic programs, and to offer literacy and other educational services to the

families of the participating children.

The Tiger Pride Before- and After- School Program provides a safe and caring environment for our elementary students. The main focus of the program is to foster academic and social growth in addition to providing a much-needed service to our district.

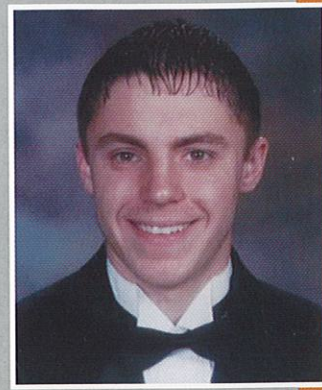
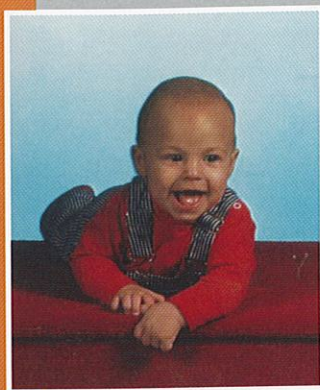
Volunteers and mentors have been an integral part of this program, from the teachers to the Truman State University students, everyone has contributed to the betterment of our elementary students.

Shanea Rusk made great memories playing softball and participating in the Varsity Cheerleading Squad as

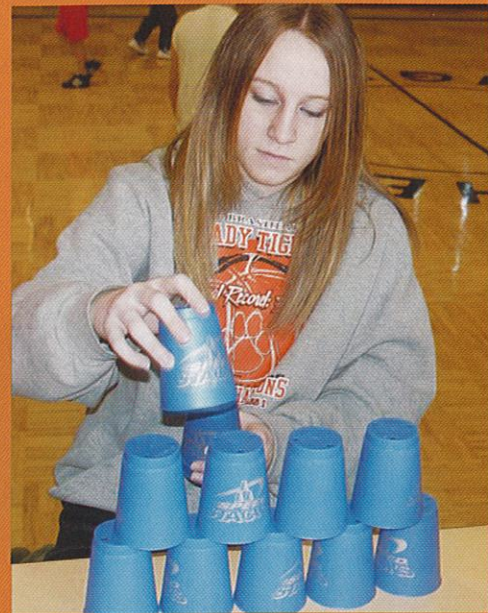
"Toby," the tiger mascot.

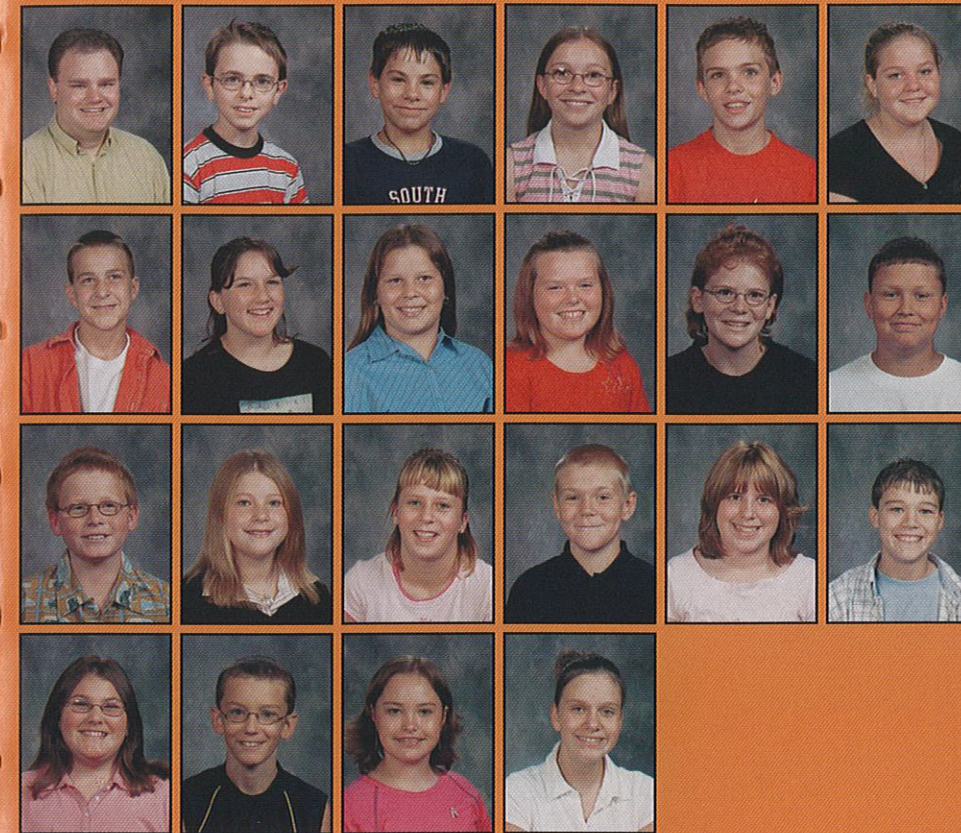

The second and third graders have had a busy year so far. Third grade consists of twenty-two eager learners while second grade only has thirteen.

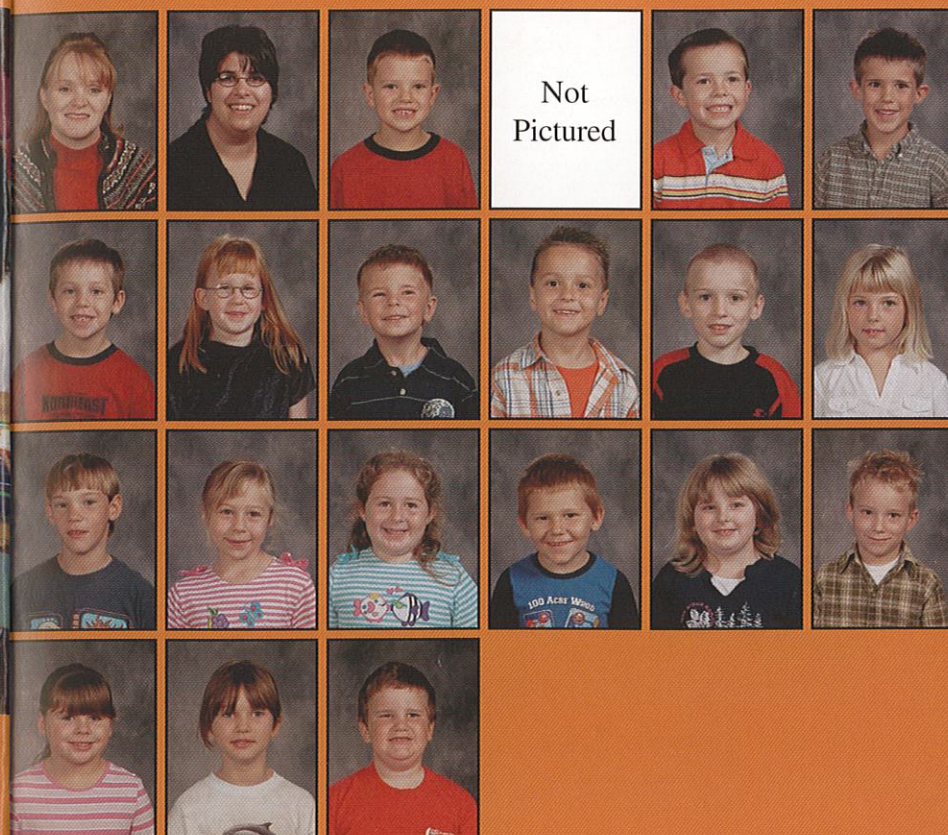
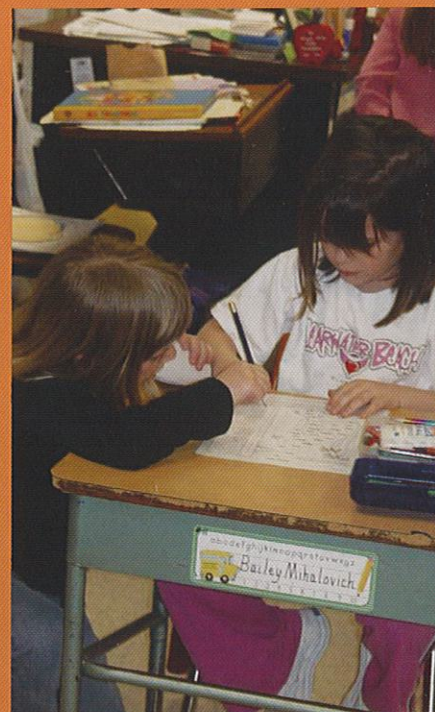
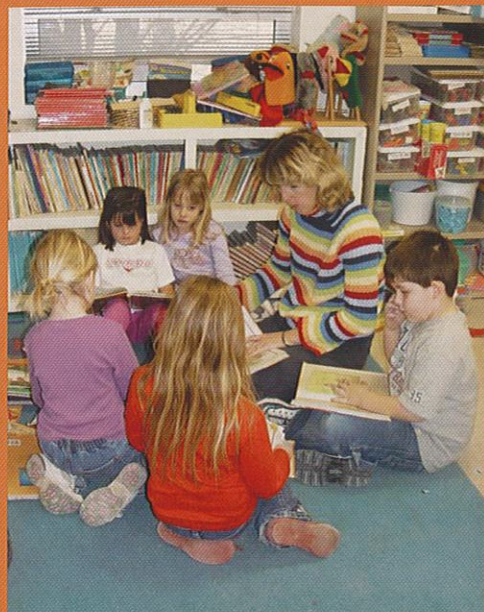
In second grade the kids have been learning and reading about many different things this year. 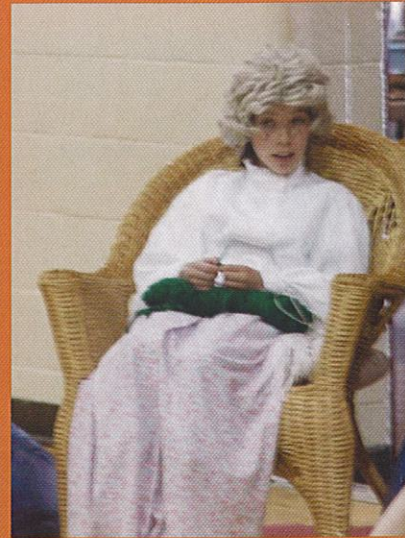

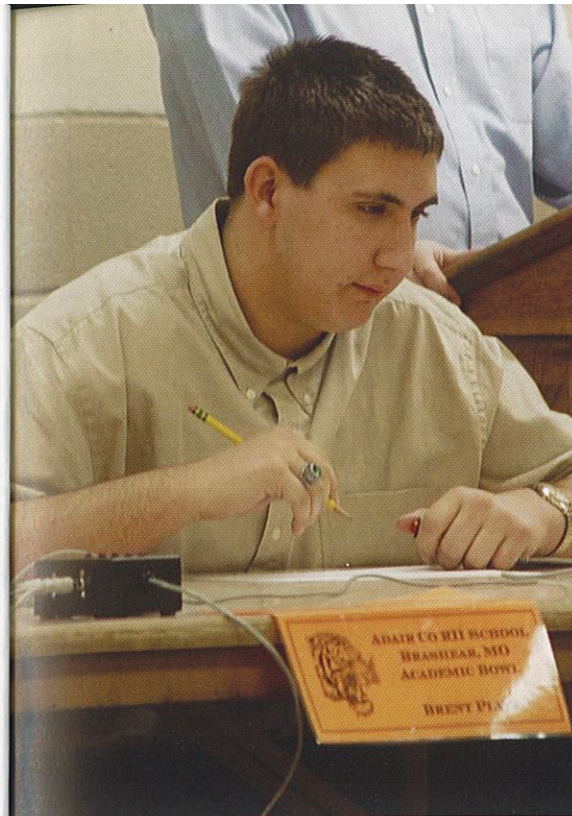

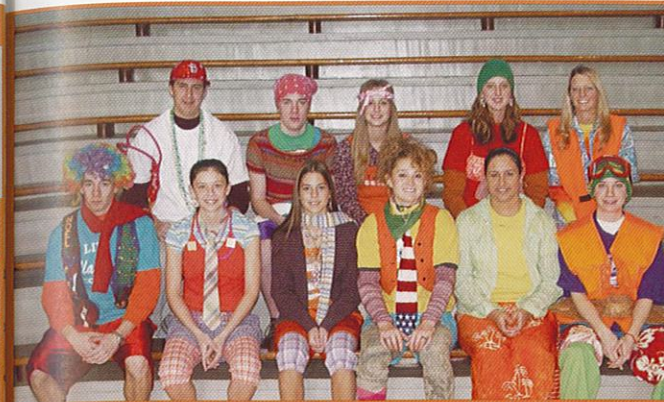

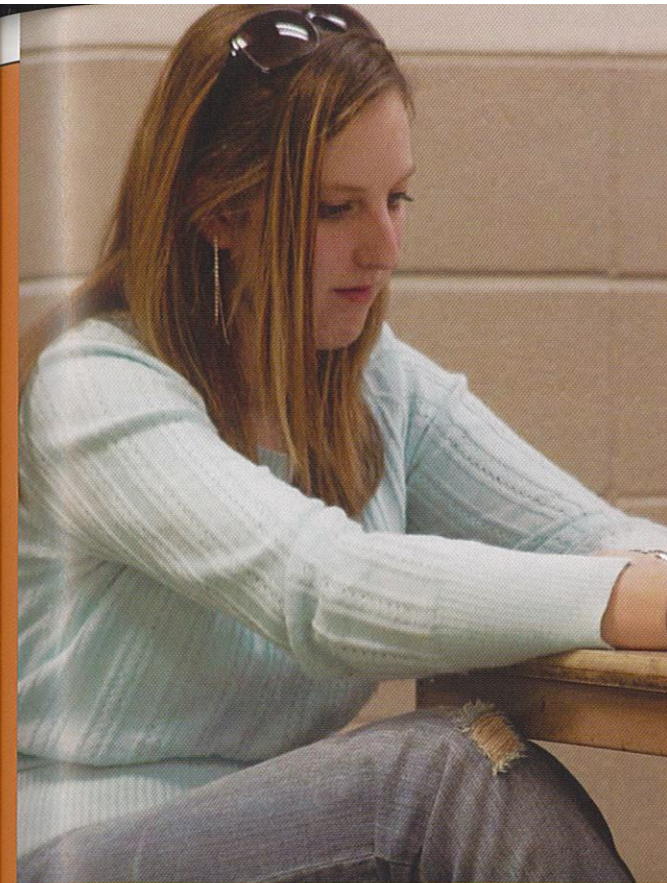
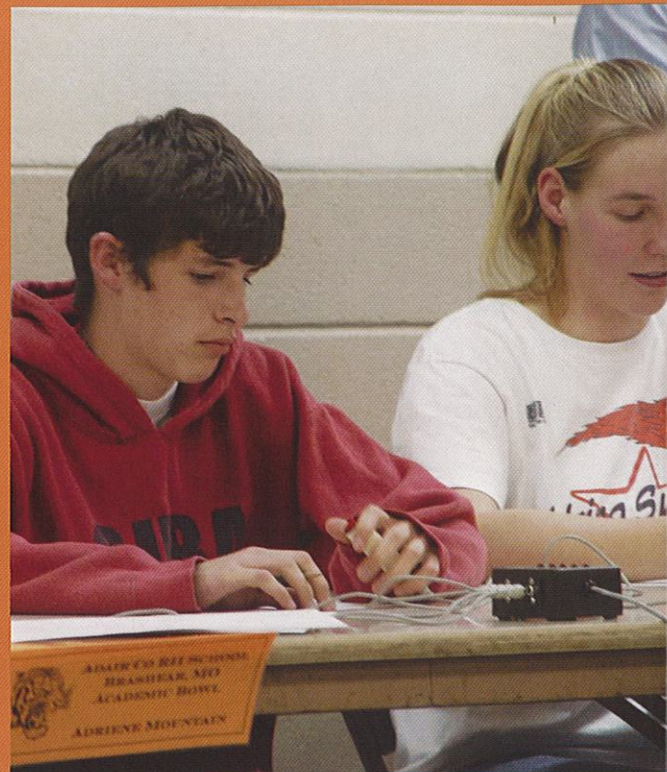
# Academic Bowl

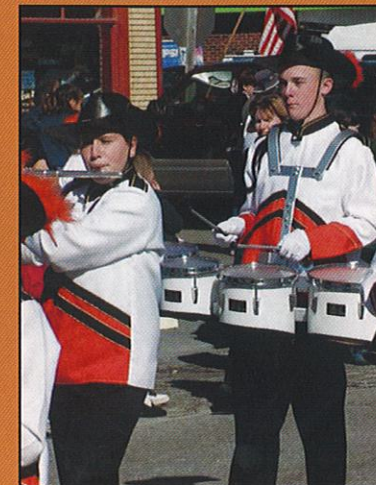

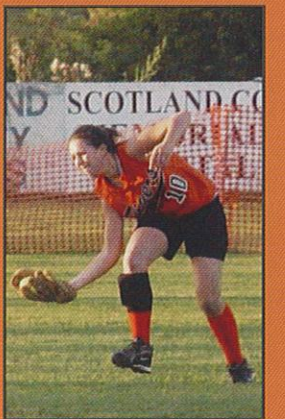

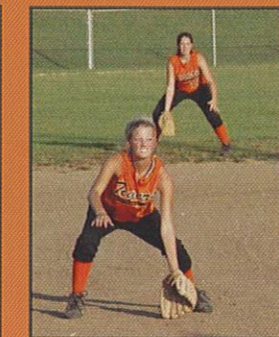

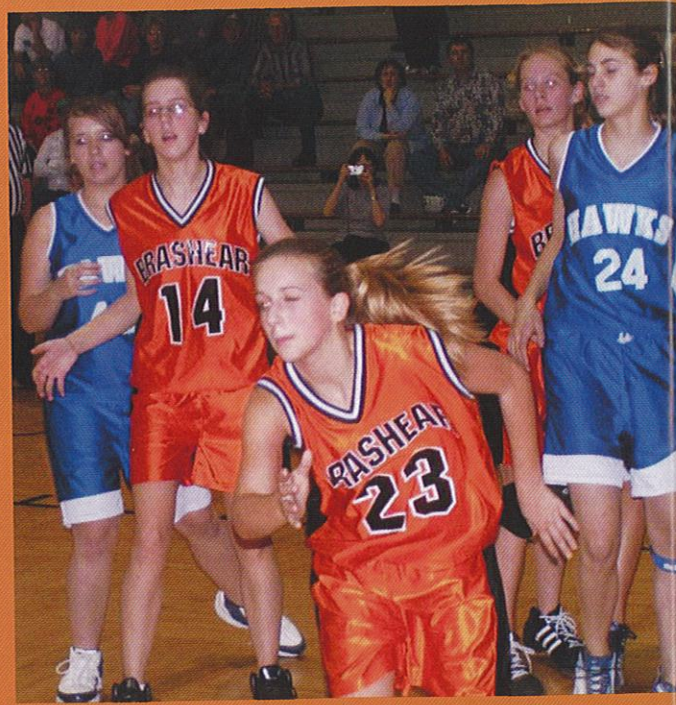

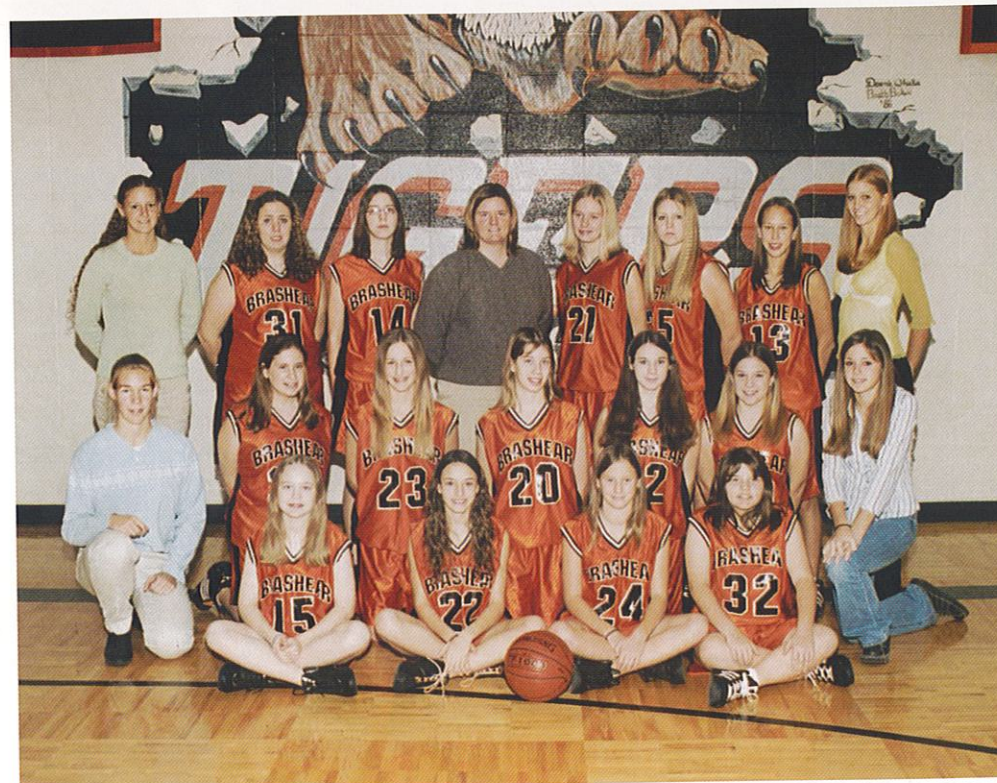

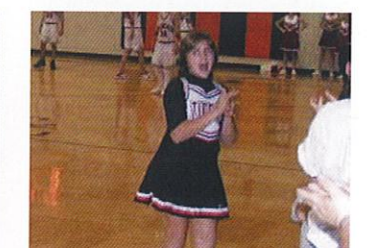
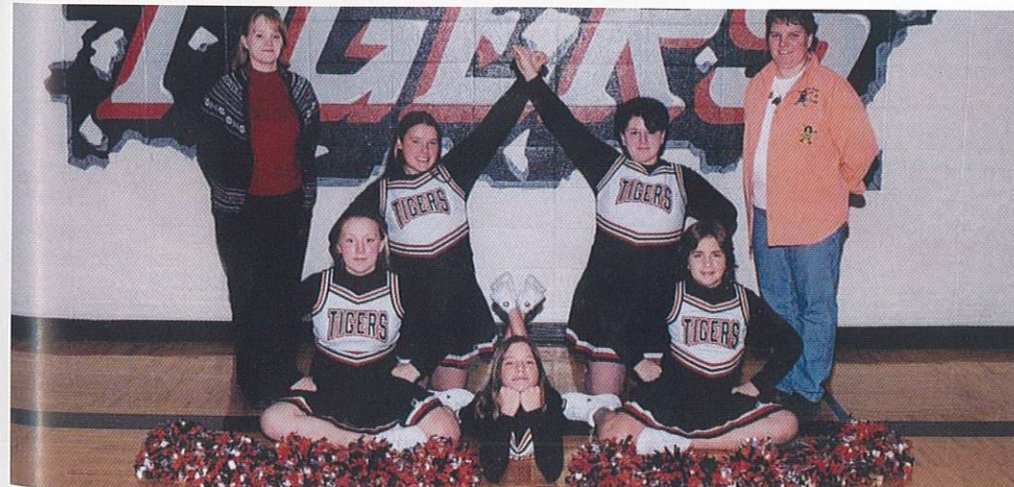
## The Junior Varsity Squad of 2004-2005

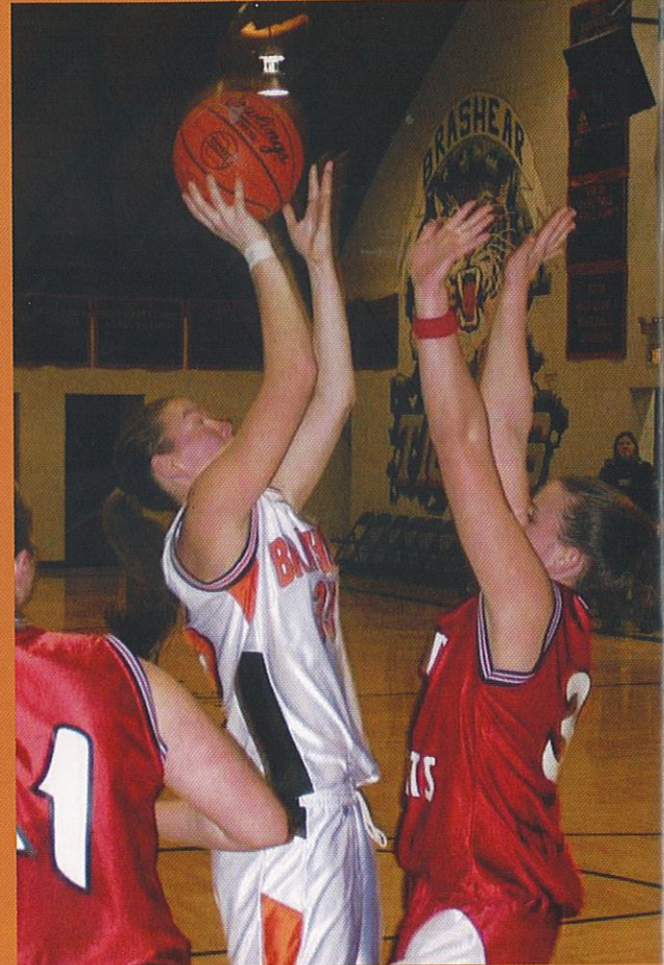

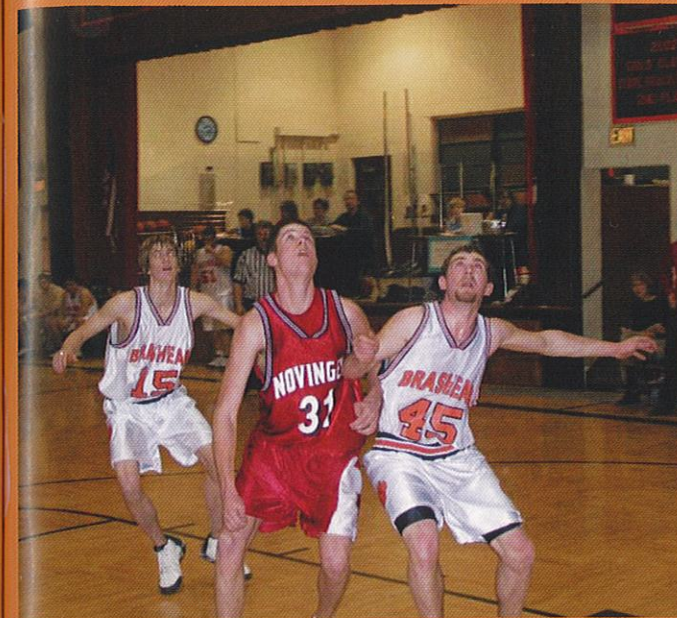
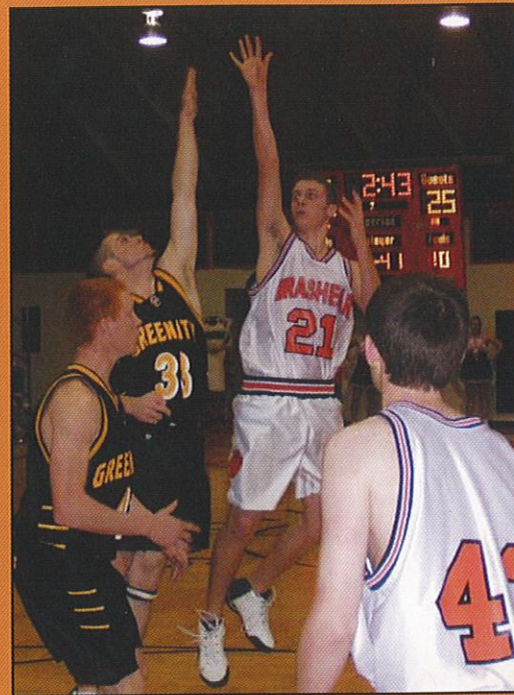
# Always Improving

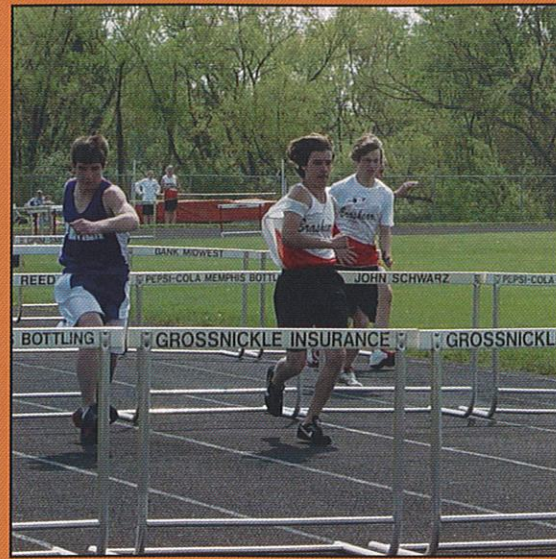

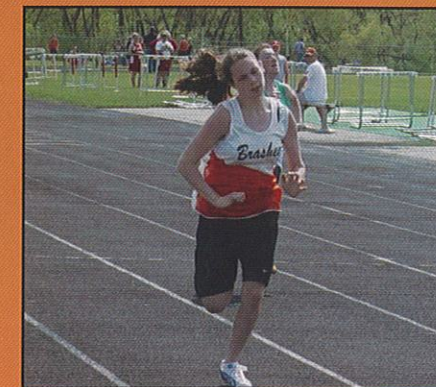

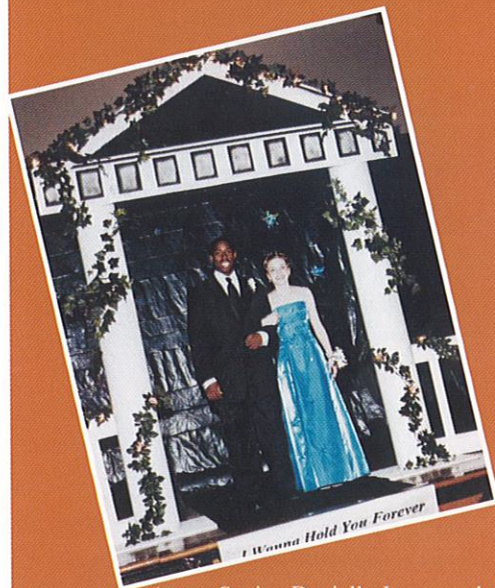

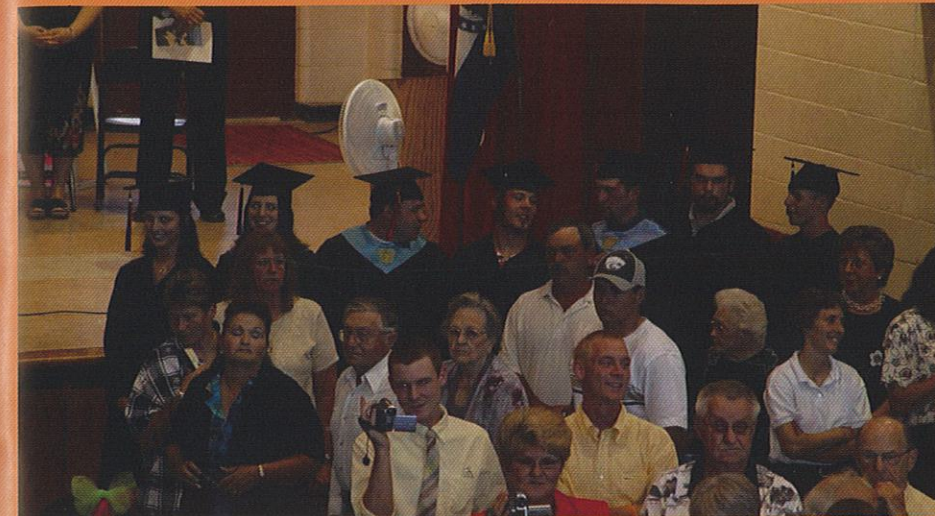
