
BRASHEAR REORGANIZED SCHOOL

Other buildings include the Art Building, the Music Building, the Industrial Arts Building and the Gibbs Elementary Building made up of two classrooms.





Mr. Hunt, who has been superintendent for twenty years, oversees the activities of both the senior high and elementary grades.






