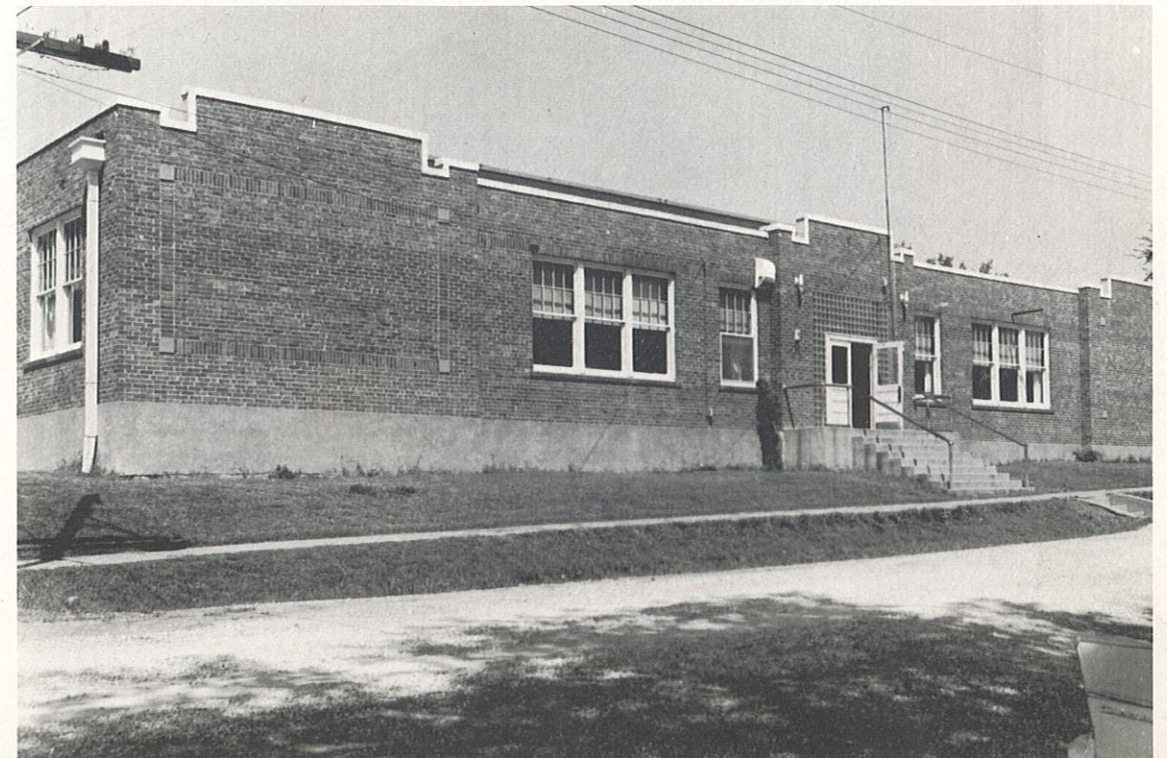

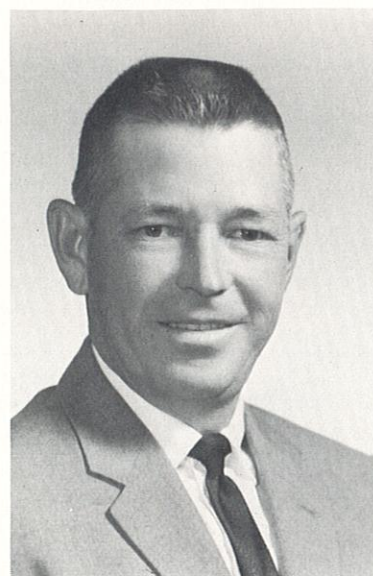
Other buildings include the Art Building, the Music Building, the Industrial Arts Building and the Gibbs Elementary Building made up of two classrooms.

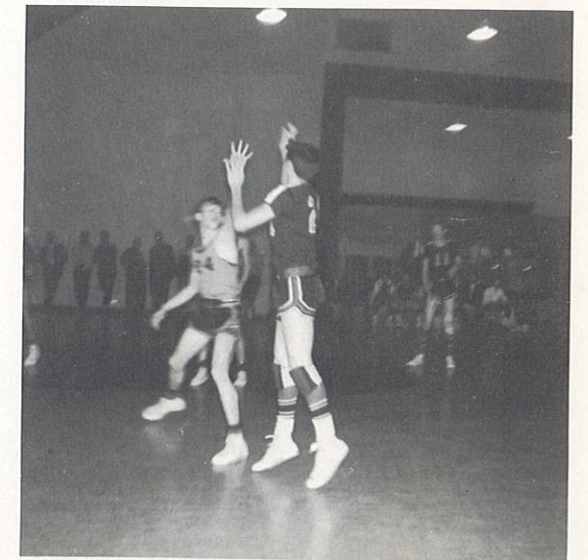
