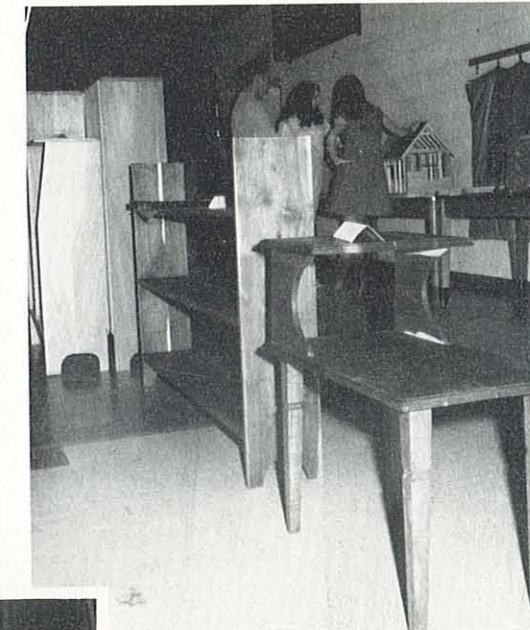

IN 1973, A TREATY WAS SIGNED TO END THE GREAT AMERICAN ATRAUSITY, THE VIET NAM WAR. THE PEACE PLAN ENDED AMERICAN INVOLVEMENT IN VIET MAN, AND GAVE THE PEOPLE HERE AT HOME A REASON TO BELIEVE THERE WOULD BE PEACE IN AMERICA. OR DID IT? THERE CAN BE NO DOUBT IN ANYONES' MIND THAT THE END OF THE WAR WAS INDEED A GREAT EVENT, BUT DOES IT GIVE THE AVERAGE AMERICAN A SOLID FOUNDATION TO BASE HIS COMPLETE BELIEFS THAT THERE WILL NOW BE PEACE FOR HIM? IT IS INDEED A TIME OF REJOICING AND THANKFULNESS IN THE LAND, AND IN MEN'S HEARTS, BUT IS IT A TIME OF PEACE? 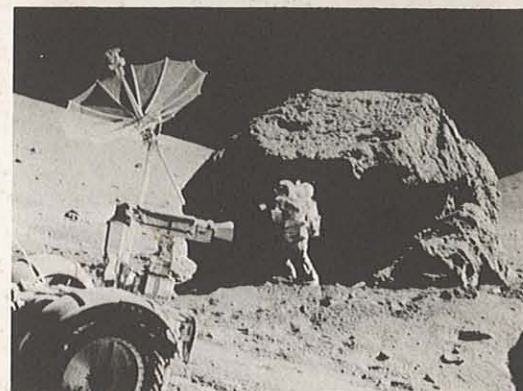
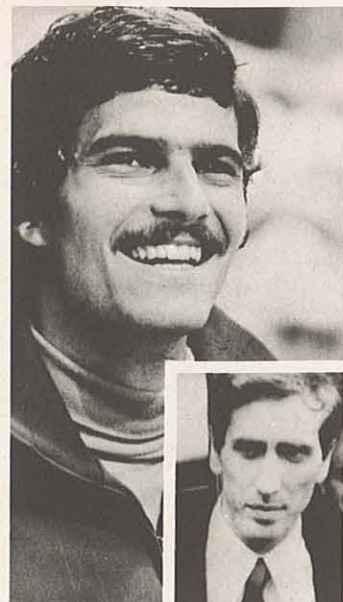
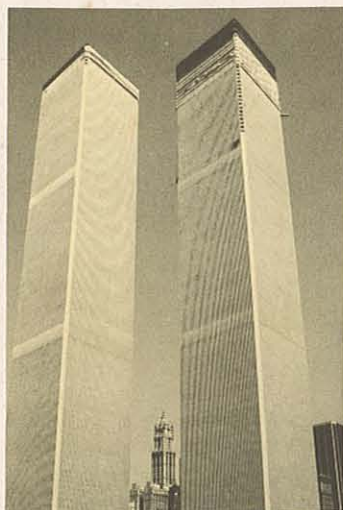
