Third Grade

Second graders enjoyed reading The Gingerbread Boy. They received a letter from the gingerbread boy asking them to go to the ending of the story so tricky fox would not eat him. 





Cory enjoyed spending time with family and friends, and hunting for all kinds of animals. He will be forever remembered in the hearts of all who knew him.








































Brashear Clubs Take A Number of Trips This Year

National Honor Society






