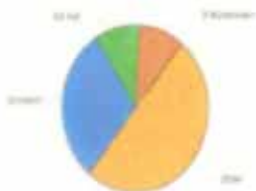

Third Grade

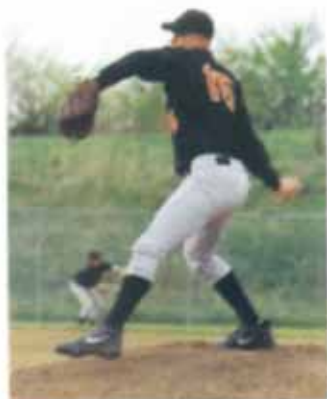

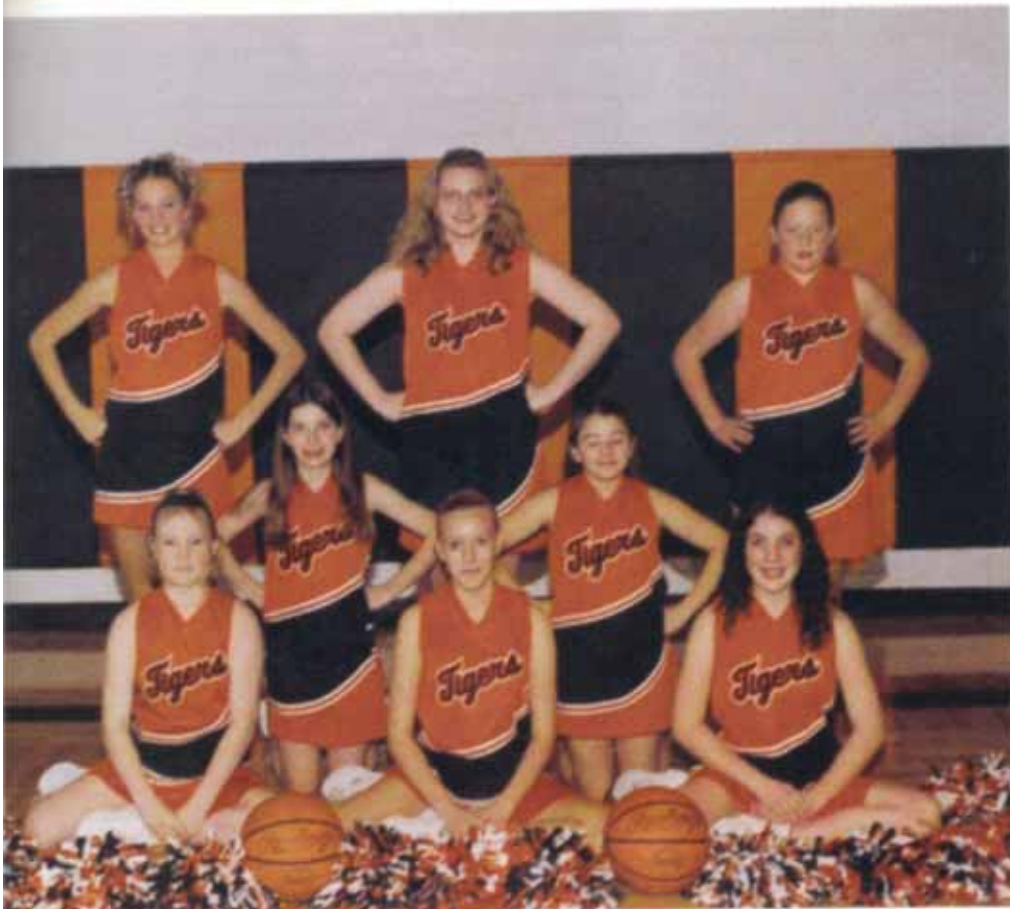

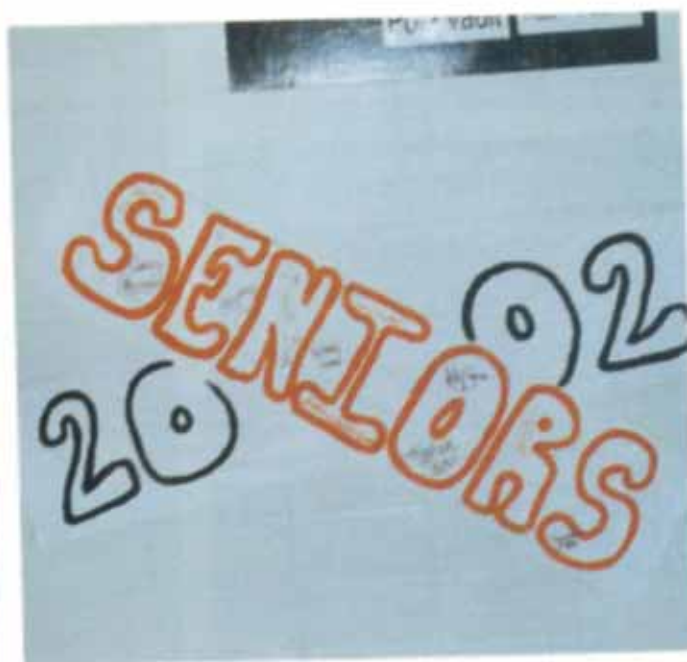

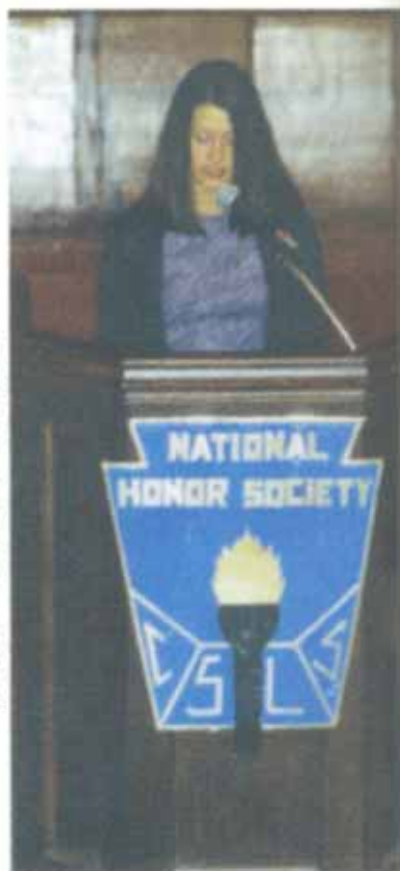
