

Third Grade

The third grade embarked on a journey through the fantasy world of fairy tales. They read and discussed common themes of fairy tales and once finished, wrote a fairy tale of their own. 



Coaches Sara Parish, Chad Zeigler, Holly Crandall, Dave Cameron and Don Wilburn have done it all. Supporting, cheering, working hard and sweatingto encourage our athletes. The coaches do a lot to represent Brashear in a positive way. All of the coaches enjoy working with teams to encourage and motivate them to do their best. This year was a season filled with honors and "bests".

The Lady Tigers earned softball conference champions. Senior Niki Peterson earned most valuable player and three other team members earned all conference honors. Five team members earned all district honors in this sport with Coach Sara Parish being named Coach of the Year.

The Lady Tigers earned a State Championship for the first time in BHS history. The girls worked their way up on the list of championships to include district champions, sectional champions, quarterfinal champions, semifinal champions and then state champions. The entire team was recognized as Pro-Tech Athletes of the Week and five girls received conference and district honors. All state honors were received by Kristin Osborn and Jenny Elsea. Coach Sara Parish was named Coach of the Year for conference, district and state.

The Tigers made history this year with back-to-back district championships. The boys ended with a record of 22-6 and 7-1 for the conference. Seniors Kelsey and Moyer were awarded conference honors with Most Valuable Player going to Nathan Kelsey. Both boys were also awarded all district honors.

The varsity Tigers track team won first in conference, second in districts and fifth at state competition. Junior high girls track won the conference title with two girls placing first in conference.

The baseball team went 6-2 in the fall season and 5-5 in the spring season. The team fell to LaPlata in district play during the spring season.






















