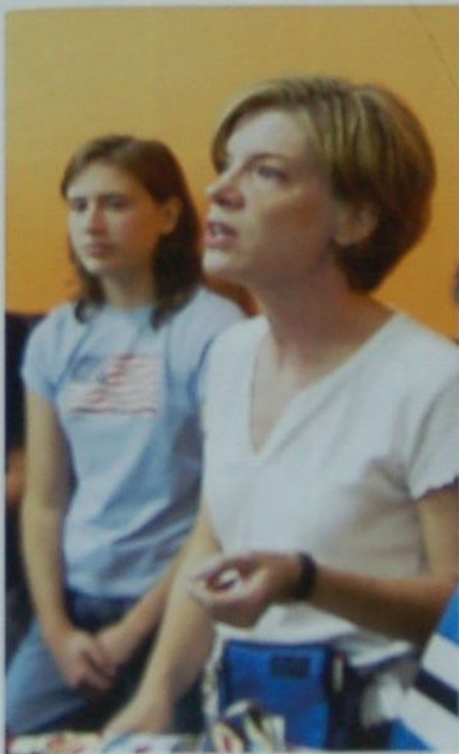

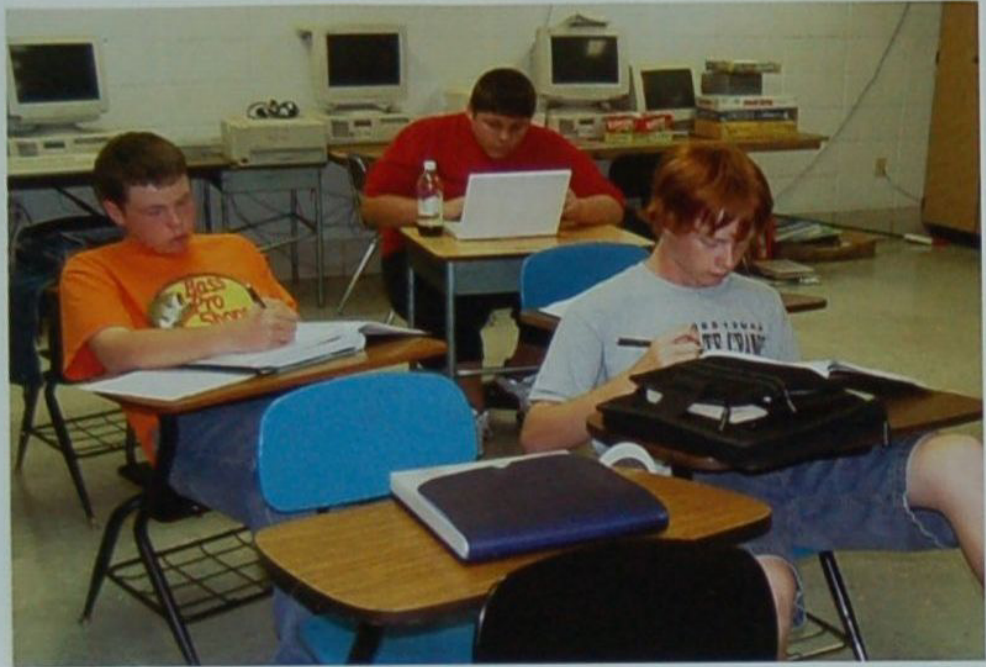

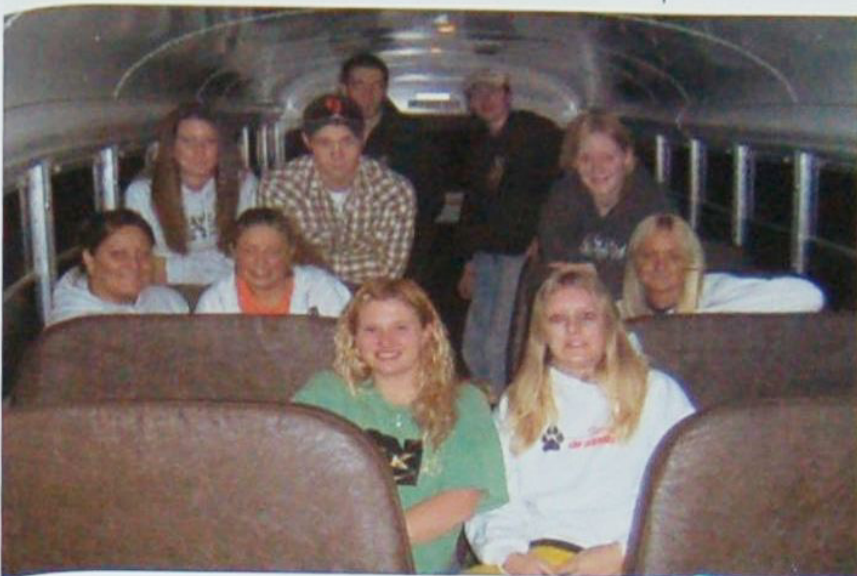

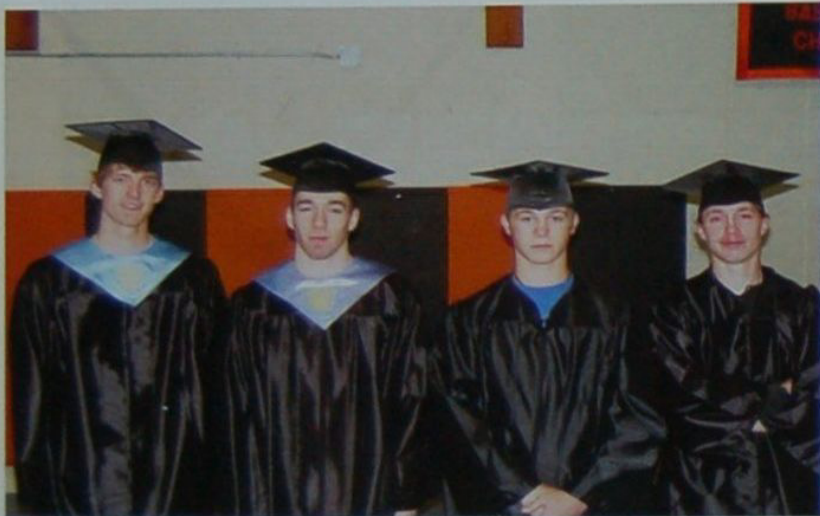
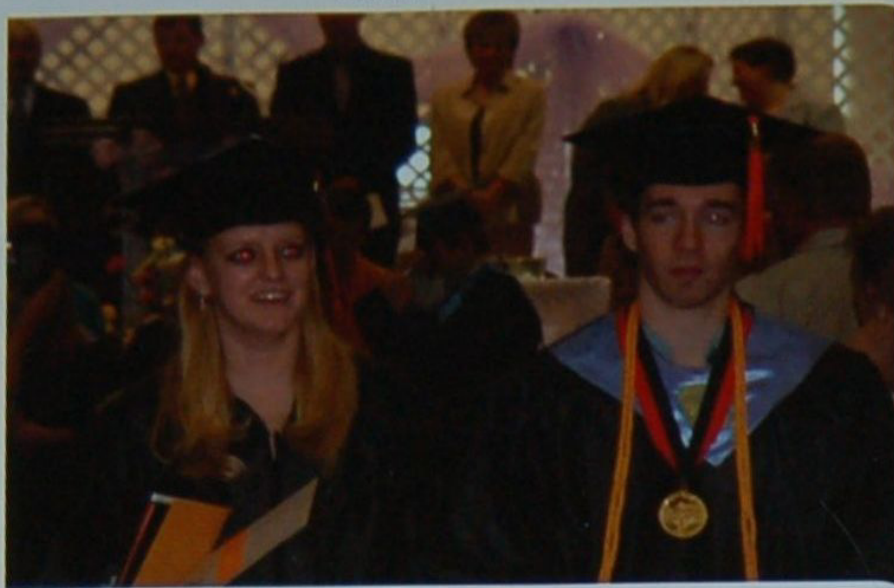
Graduation 2006

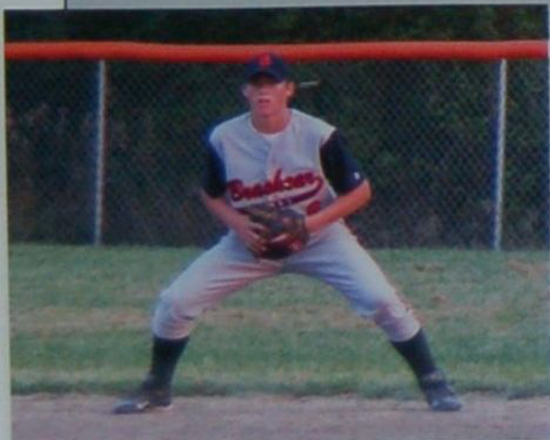
Far and Wide

This year the junior high boys basketball team and the high school girls track team were named conference champions.

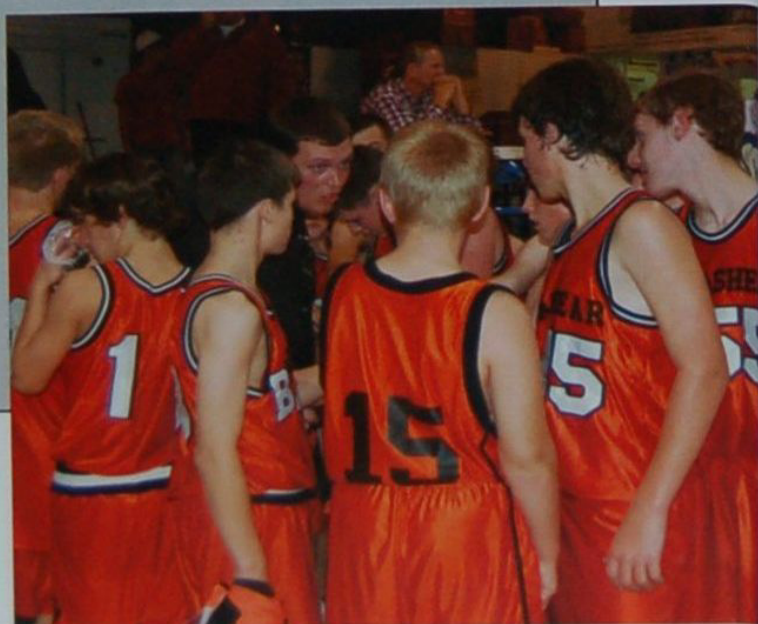

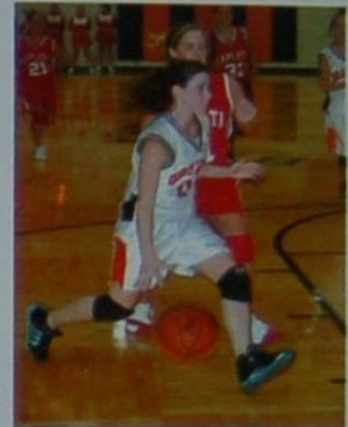

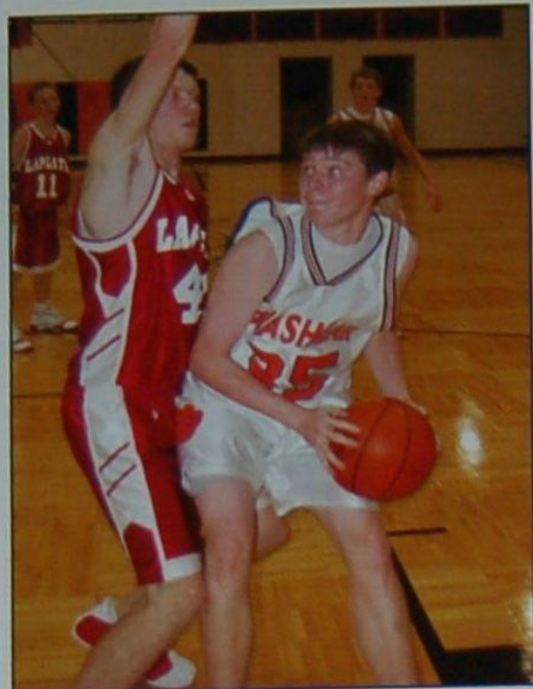

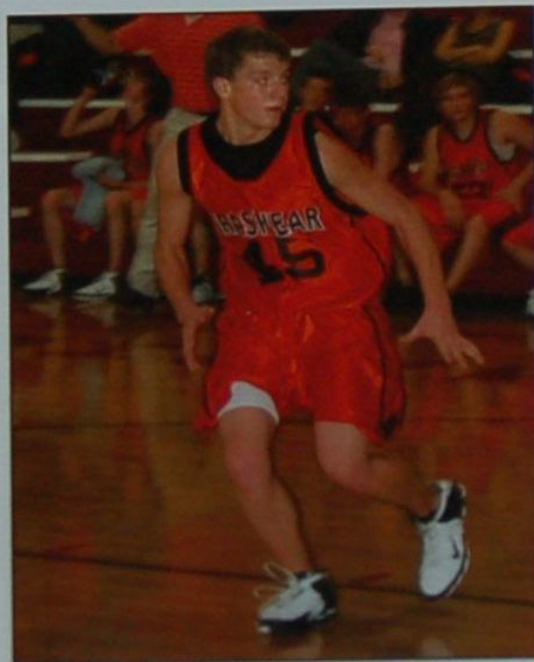

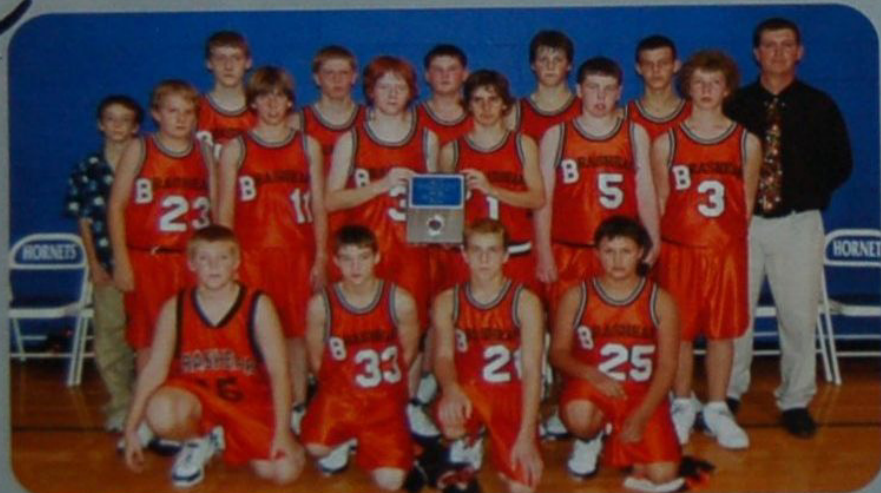
Junior High Boys Undefeated Season

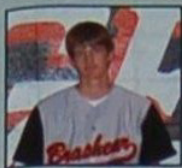

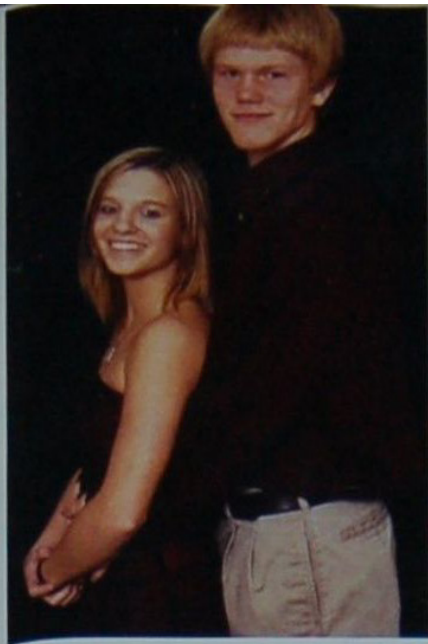

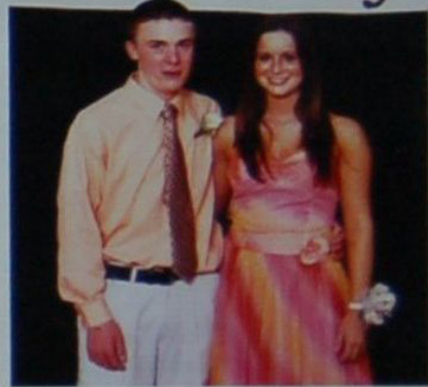

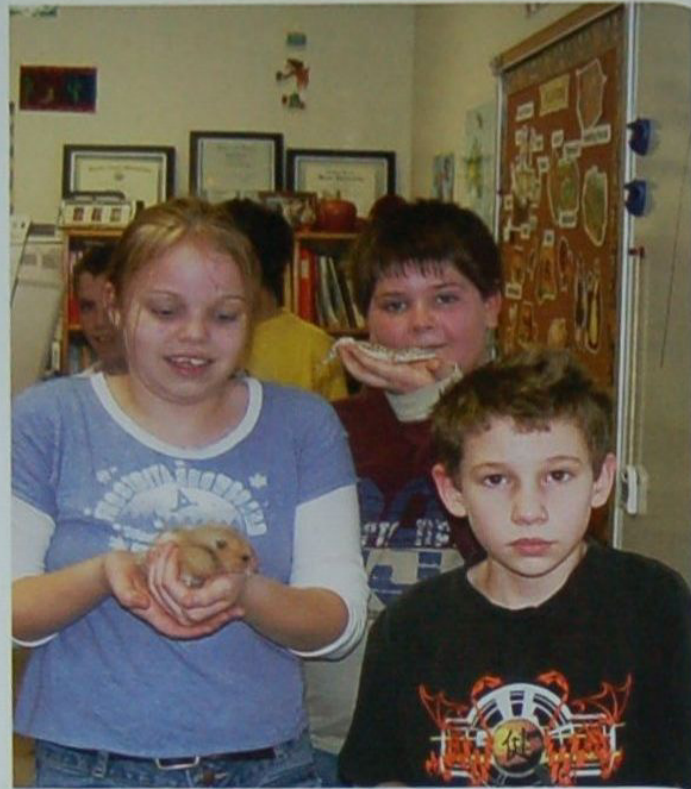

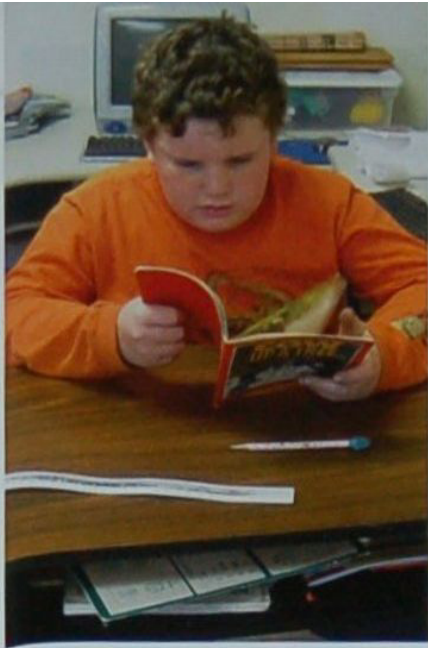

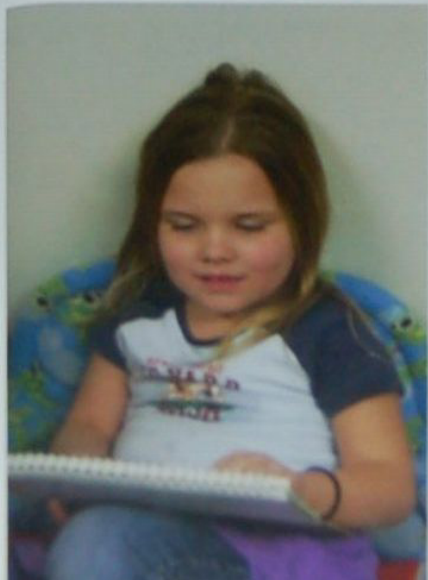

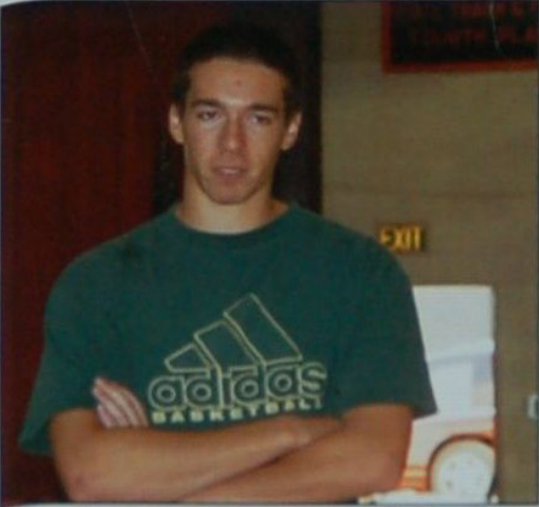
This year seniors Andrew Linhart and Kellie Primmer were the student council president and vice-president. Student council organized school dances and the drug free activity night.

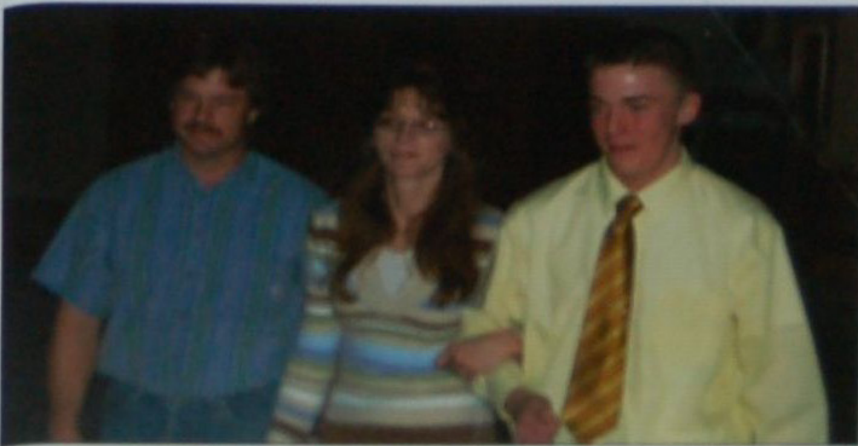
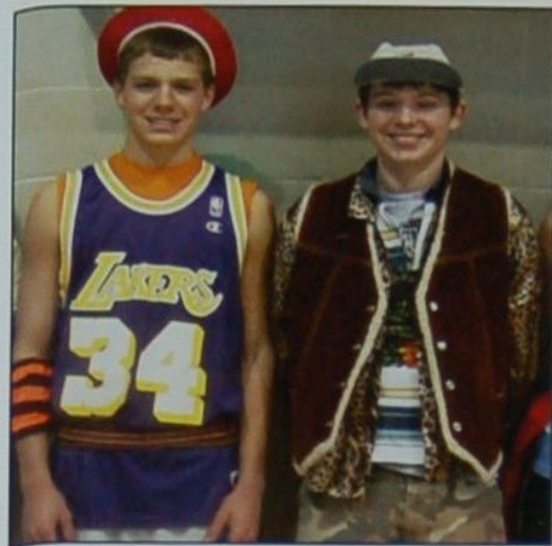
Many New Faces in National Honor Society
