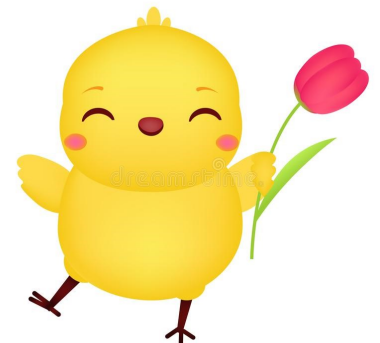



2025-2026 BUSY BEES ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

- **Age requirements:** Students must be 3 years of age prior to August 1, 2025 to attend a half day and 4 years of age prior to August 1, 2025 to attend a full day. Students 4 years of age may choose to attend half day only.
- Enrollment is available only to children who **reside in our district**. We will not be accepting out of district students.
 - *Only 20 students will be accepted into preschool. Please note that older students will have top priority.
 - *Please fill out and turn in the pre-enrollment form to get your student on the preschool list by **April 30, 2025**.
 - *Parents will be contacted by **Friday, May 23, 2025** and will be notified if their child will be enrolled for the 2025-2026 school year.
- All students will be charged \$200 dollars to cover snacks throughout the year.
 - ***First payment of \$100 must be received by August 1, 2025 to keep your student on the enrollment list.**
 - ***Second payment of \$100 must be received by December 1, 2025 to continue enrollment.**
- Students **must** be fully potty trained.
- Parents **must** submit an immunization record for their student to be on file at the school.
- All students will adhere to our policies found in our elementary handbook.
- Half day students will have the option to eat school lunch if parents wish. **All** half day students will be dismissed at 11:30 a.m.
- Full day students will be dismissed at 3:30 p.m.
